4	Supporting the establishment of a commemorative commission to honor Booker T. Washington with a
5 6	statue in the State Capitol.

10 11	WHEREAS, educator, orator, and activist Booker T. Washington's life and legacy is deeply tied to his roots in Virginia; and
12	WHEREAS, born into slavery in Franklin County, Booker T. Washington spent his childhood in
13	Virginia until, after emancipation, he moved with his family to West Virginia, where, at age nine, he
14	began working in salt furnaces and coal mines; during this time, he learned to read and write; and
15 16	WHEREAS, determined to continue his education, Booker T. Washington returned to Virginia and enrolled in Hampton Normal and Agricultural Institute, now Hampton University; he excelled as a
17	student and after graduating returned to teach at Hampton Institute; and
18	WHEREAS, his time at Hampton Institute guided Booker T. Washington in founding Tuskegee
19	Normal and Industrial Institute in Alabama in 1881; at the time of its establishment, Tuskegee Institute's
20 21	first class held only 30 students, but in less than a decade the school expanded its enrollment to more than 1 000 students; and
²¹ 22	than 1,000 students; and WHEREAS, Booker T. Washington worked tirelessly to bridge racial divides, to make education
23	available to all, and to advance civil rights; and
24	WHEREAS, in closing his autobiography, Up from Slavery, Booker T. Washington describes
25	returning to Virginia at the invitation of African American citizens of Richmond to speak to an
26 27	integrated audience that included the members of the Senate and the House of Delegates, who voted to attend as a body, a testament to his life's work toward racial reconciliation; and
28	WHEREAS, in recognition of his legacy and contributions to the Commonwealth, it is fitting that
29	Booker T. Washington be honored with a statue in the State Capitol; now, therefore, be it
30	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly support
31 32	the establishment of a commemorative commission to honor Booker T. Washington with a statue in the State Capitol; and, be it
33	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Governor be requested to establish a commemorative commission
34	(the Commission) that shall consist of the Governor of Virginia, who shall serve as chairman thereof,
35	the Lieutenant Governor of Virginia, the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Rules, the Speaker of
36 37	the House of Delegates, the Clerk of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Delegates, the Curator of the Capitol Square Preservation Council, and three other members to be appointed by the Governor.
38	The Commission shall study and recommend to the General Assembly an appropriate statue in the
39	State Capitol to commemorate the life, achievements, and legacy of Booker T. Washington. All agencies
40	of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.
41 42	Until completion of the Commission's work or the erection of the statue, whichever occurs later, the
42 43	Commission shall report annually by December 1 the status of its work, including any findings and recommendations, to the General Assembly, beginning on December 1, 2021. The report shall be posted
44	on the General Assembly's website.
