3 Commending Dr. Ronald A. Crutcher. 4

WHEREAS, Dr. Ronald A. Crutcher, a distinguished leader in higher education administration, has served as president of the University of Richmond for more than five years; and

8 WHEREAS, a graduate of Miami University in Ohio, Ronald Crutcher holds master's and doctoral 9 degrees from Yale University and is an accomplished cellist who formerly played with the Cincinnati 10 Symphony Orchestra; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Crutcher previously served as the director of the Butler School of Music at the 11 University of Texas at Austin and dean of the Cleveland Institute of Music; he led the administration of 12 Wheaton College as president for 10 years before joining the University of Richmond in 2015; and 13

14 WHEREAS, as the first African American president of the University of Richmond, Ronald Crutcher 15 emphasized the institution's commitment to fighting racism and sexism wherever it was present, championed free expression and civil debate, and promoted diversity and inclusivity by hiring more 16 women and people of color; and 17

WHEREAS, Ronald Crutcher worked to increase engagement with University of Richmond alumni, 18 19 leading to record levels of philanthropy during his tenure, developed an office to support students 20 applying for national grants and fellowships, and created a strategic communications division to raise the 21 institution's reputation and profile throughout the Commonwealth and the United States; and

22 WHEREAS, under Ronald Crutcher's leadership, the University of Richmond was ranked among the 23 best liberal arts colleges in the nation by U.S. News and World Report; and

24 WHEREAS, Ronald Crutcher is chair of the Board of Directors of the American Council on 25 Education, served on the board of the American Association of Colleges and Universities and is a founding co-chair of Liberal Education and America's Promise; he led the University of Richmond to 26 27 become a charter member of the American Talent Initiative, an organization that advocates for 28 socioeconomic diversity in higher education; and 29

WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, Ronald Crutcher helped support the institution and set 30 an example for higher education administrators nationally by taking a pay cut to help offset the unanticipated and significant expenses associated with responding to the pandemic; and

WHÊREAS, outside of his work with the University of Richmond, Ronald Crutcher offers his 32 33 leadership and expertise to the board of the Richmond Symphony and has performed throughout the 34 United States and Europe as a member of the Klemperer Trio; now, therefore, be it

35 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 36 commend Dr. Ronald A. Crutcher for his years of outstanding service as president of the University of 37 Richmond; and, be it

38 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 39 for presentation to Dr. Ronald A. Crutcher as an expression of the General Assembly's admiration for

40 his work to advance the field of higher education and contributions to the Richmond community and the Commonwealth of Virginia. 41
