A BILL to study waste control and recycling; permits.

Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

10 1. § 1. That the Department of Environmental Quality and the Virginia Waste Management Board shall not issue any permit for the construction, modification, or expansion of a new or existing municipal solid waste landfill that will accept 3,500 tons or more of municipal solid waste per day until the
13 General Assembly enacts legislation incorporating any findings and recommendations of the Waste Diversion and Recycling Task Force pursuant to subsection 2 E.

15 § 2. A. That the Department of Environmental Quality (the Department) is requested to continue its 16 Waste Diversion and Recycling Task Force (the Task Force) that was created pursuant to SJ 42 (2020). B. That the Department shall include in the Task Force additional members including (i) three 17 18 directly impacted community members living within a reasonable vicinity of a currently permitted and operating landfill; (ii) three experts on solid waste management at the academic or research level, who 19 20 shall be independent and not associated with or employed by any waste management public or private 21 company or industry association or advocacy group; (iii) two members of the Virginia Council on 22 Environmental Justice; (iv) one representative of city and town governments; (v) one representative of 23 county governments; and (vi) two directors of the solid waste management planning units. Additional 24 stakeholders may be permitted to participate in the Task Force meetings and documents, but shall have 25 nonvoting privileges when making final recommendations and shall not be counted for purposes of 26 establishing a quorum.

27 C. That in addition to those topics of study identified in SJ 42 (2020), the Task Force shall (i) 28 further study available options to divert from landfills in the Commonwealth food residuals, organic 29 waste, and baseline recyclables generated or originating from outside of the Commonwealth; (ii) conduct a meta-analysis or systematic review of the policies, legislation, practices, and programs 30 31 proposed and implemented by other states and draw upon such programs in considering recommendations for waste diversion policies; (iii) examine Virginia's status as a prime destination for 32 33 out-of-state trash and explore ways in which waste from other states can be diverted from Virginia's 34 landfills; (iv) investigate the role of a composting and food donation infrastructure in reducing the 35 volume of waste that is accepted by landfills, including upgrading and refining existing food donation infrastructure, identifying food material and organic waste generators and haulers, comparing the use of 36 37 in-house composting with regional composting hubs, studying the ideal distance between composing 38 hubs and waste generators, considering the permitting of composting hubs, and exploring markets and 39 systems for composting services; and (v) study implementation of programs generally known as Pay-As-You-Throw, technologies such as gasification and anaerobic digestion, and any other emerging 40 41 technology or program relevant to waste management.

D. That in developing recommendations the Task Force shall adopt the waste management hierarchy
as developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), take guidance from the EPA
Sustainable Materials Management Program Strategic Plan, and place emphasis on policies and
practices that are socially responsible and environmentally sustainable.

E. That the Department shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2022, and shall submit to the
Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and
recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report
shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2023 Regular
