**4. Title:** Child support payments for juveniles in custody of or committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice

**5. Summary:** The proposed bill provides that the Department of Juvenile Justice is no longer required to apply for child support from, and the parent of a juvenile is no longer responsible to pay child support to, the Department of Social Services for a juvenile who is in the temporary custody of or committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice.

The bill provisions do not modify, reduce, or forgive any arrearages or liens accumulated or established that are in effect through June 30, 2021.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary (Line #8)

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), the child support payments received from the Department of Social Services (DSS) are used to help cover the general care cost of juveniles under their custodial responsibility. Under the proposed bill, DJJ estimates an annual loss of funding of approximately \$435,278. This funding is used to help cover the general care cost of housing, treatment and educating juveniles in DJJ's custody.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact on the Department of Social Services.
