Fiscal Implications: This legislation, as amended, adds language to § 63.2-1916 requiring that administrative support orders contain a provision requiring an obligor to keep the Department of Social Services or a court informed of, in addition to the name, address, and telephone number of his current employer, any change to his employment status and if he has filed a claim for or is receiving unemployment benefits. The amended legislation will require system changes to modify the administrative support orders. The agency indicates that costs are estimated at \$10,000 one-time funding in FY 2022 (\$3,400 special funds and \$6,600 federal funds). If the agency cannot absorb this cost within its current appropriation, this amount can be appropriated administratively.
