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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 64.2-2004 of the Code of Virginia, relating to guardianship and 3 conservatorship; notice of hearing.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 64.2-2004 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 64.2-2004. Notice of hearing; jurisdictional.

9 A. Upon the filing of the petition, the court shall promptly set a date, time, and location for a 10 hearing. The respondent shall be given reasonable notice of the hearing. The respondent may not waive notice, and a failure to properly notify the respondent shall be jurisdictional. 11

12 B. A respondent, whether or not he resides in the Commonwealth, shall be personally served with 13 the notice of the hearing, a copy of the petition, and a copy of the order appointing a guardian ad litem 14 pursuant to § 64.2-2003. A certification, in the guardian ad litem's report required by subsection B of 15 § 64.2-2003, that the guardian ad litem personally served the respondent with the notice, a copy of the petition, and a copy of the order appointing a guardian ad litem shall constitute valid personal service 16 17 for purposes of this section.

 \tilde{C} . A copy of the notice, together with a copy of the petition, shall be mailed by first-class mail by 18 19 the petitioner at least seven 10 days before the hearing to all adult individuals and to all entities whose 20 names and post office addresses appear in the petition. The court, for good cause shown, may waive the 21 advance notice required by this subsection. If the advance notice is waived, the petitioner shall promptly 22 mail by first-class mail a copy of the petition and any order entered to those individuals and entities.

23 D. Any adult individual or entity whose name and post office addresses appear in the petition may 24 become a party to the proceeding by filing a pleading in accordance with Rule 1:4 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Virginia. Such individual or entity shall mail his pleadings via first-class mail to the 25 26 petitioner, any counsel of record, the guardian ad litem, and all other adult individuals and entities 27 whose names and post office addresses appear in the petition. Such pleading may also be sent via 28 electronic mail or facsimile to all counsel of record and the guardian ad litem, as well as those other 29 adult individuals and entities whose email addresses or facsimile numbers are known to the person 30 filing the pleading. If a cross-petition is filed, the petitioner shall file a response to such cross-petition.

31 E. The notice to the respondent shall include a brief statement in at least 14-point type of the 32 purpose of the proceedings and shall inform the respondent of the right to be represented by counsel pursuant to § 64.2-2006 and to a hearing pursuant to § 64.2-2007. Additionally, the notice shall include 33 34 the following statement in conspicuous, bold print.

35 WARNING TO THE RESPONDENT

36 AT THE HEARING YOU MAY LOSE MANY OF YOUR RIGHTS. A GUARDIAN MAY BE 37 APPOINTED TO MAKE PERSONAL DECISIONS FOR YOU. A CONSERVATOR MAY BE 38 APPOINTED TO MAKE DECISIONS CONCERNING YOUR PROPERTY AND FINANCES. THE 39 APPOINTMENT MAY AFFECT CONTROL OF HOW YOU SPEND YOUR MONEY, HOW YOUR 40 PROPERTY IS MANAGED AND CONTROLLED, WHO MAKES YOUR MEDICAL DECISIONS, 41 WHERE YOU LIVE, WHETHER YOU ARE ALLOWED TO VOTE, AND OTHER IMPORTANT 42 RIGHTS.

43 NOTIFICATION TO OTHERS

44 ANY ADULT INDIVIDUAL OR ENTITY WHOSE NAME AND POST OFFICE ADDRESSES APPEAR IN THE PETITION FOR APPOINTMENT MAY BECOME A PARTY TO THIS ACTION BY FILING A 45 PLEADING WITH THE CIRCUIT COURT IN WHICH THIS CASE IS PENDING. THAT PLEADING 46 MUST BE MAILED TO THE PETITIONER, ANY COUNSEL OF RECORD, THE GUARDIAN AD 47 LITEM, AND ALL OTHER ADULT INDIVIDUALS AND ENTITIES WHOSE NAMES AND POST OFFICE ADDRESSES APPEAR IN THE PETITION. IN ADDITION, SUCH PLEADING MAY BE SENT 48 49 50 BY EMAIL OR FAX TO ANY SUCH OTHER ADULT INDIVIDUAL OR ENTITY FOR WHOM SUCH 51 EMAIL ADDRESS OR FAX NUMBER IS KNOWN.

52 E. F. The petitioner shall file with the clerk of the circuit court a statement of compliance with 53 subsections B, C, and \mathbf{D} E. Certification of personal service made by the guardian ad litem as required 54 by subsection B may satisfy this requirement as to compliance with subsection B.
