9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 17.1-805.1 as follows:
11	§ 17.1-805.1. Discretionary sentencing guideline midpoints for certain defendants.
12	The Commission shall adopt discretionary felony sentencing guidelines that may increase the
13	midpoint of the recommended sentencing range based on the defendant's record of convictions for
14	violent felony offenses, as defined in subsection C of § 17.1-805.
15	For guidelines that become effective on or after July 1, 2022, the Commission may increase the
16	midpoint of the recommended sentencing range for such defendants as set forth in subsection A of
17	§ 17.1-805 or the Commission may recommend increases in the midpoint to the degree indicated by
18	historical data for felony offenses sentenced in the Commonwealth. Any recommendations adopted by the
19	Commission to modify the sentencing guidelines midpoints shall be contained in the annual report
20	required under § 17.1-803 and shall become effective in accordance with § 17.1-806.
21	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or commitment. Burguent to $\$$ 30.10.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
22 23	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation is \$0 for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities and
23 24	cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department of Juvenile
