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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 8 of Title 23.1 an article numbered
13	4, consisting of sections numbered 23.1-819 through 23.1-822, as follows:
14	Article 4.
15	Campus Safety; Hazing.
16	§ 23.1-819. Definitions.
17	For the purposes of this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:
18 19	"Hazing" means the same as that term is defined in § 18.2-56.
19 20	"Institution" or "institution of higher education" means any nonprofit private institution of higher education and any public institution of higher education as defined in § 23.1-100.
20 21	"Local organization" means a group that is not chartered or recognized by an institution or a
22	national organization but is composed of members who are students at such institution and the
$\overline{23}$	institution is aware of the local organization's existence or becomes aware of its existence after a hazing
24	incident is reported to the institution.
25	"New member" means an individual who has been offered an invitation for membership in a student
26	organization with new members but has not yet been initiated and is not recognized as a full member of
27	the organization.
28	"New member event" means an official event or gathering hosted by a student organization with new
29	members prior to new members of such organization being initiated into the organization to which all
30 31	new members and members of the student organization hosting the event are invited or are instructed to attend.
31 32	"Potential new member" means an individual who has expressed interest in joining a student
32 33	organization with new members by signing up to go through a recruitment process for such organization
33 34	or organizations.
35	"Student organization recognized by an institution of higher education" means any group or
36	organization on campus, including varsity intercollegiate and club athletic teams, recognized by an
37	institution of higher education.
38	"Student organization with new members" means a student organization officially recognized by an
39	institution of higher education structured in such a way that upon invitation for membership, individuals
40	do not automatically become members of such organization and have a period of time between
41	invitation for membership and being initiated into membership. "Student organization with new
42 43	members" does not include any varsity intercollegiate or club athletic team. § 23.1-820. Advisor; new member events.
<b>4</b> 4	A. Each student organization with new members shall have an advisor present at all new member
45	events. Such advisor shall not be a student or a former member of the student organization with new
46	members or if applicable, the national organization with which such student organization with new
47	members is affiliated. The student organization with new members may select the advisor who shall
<b>48</b>	subsequently be approved by the institution prior to serving as such advisor or the organization may
49	request that the institution provide an advisor for such events. For new member events that are
50	ceremonies, rituals, or other such events that are only permitted to be attended by the new members and
51	members of the student organization, the advisor shall be present on the premises at all times but upon
52 52	the request of the leadership of the organization, shall leave the room where such ceremonies, rituals,
53 54	or other such events only permitted to be attended by the new members and members are conducted. By The advisor for each student organization with new members as described in subsection A shall
54 55	B. The advisor for each student organization with new members as described in subsection A shall undergo hazing prevention training and provide all members and new members with extensive, current,
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and in-person education about hazing, the dangers of hazing, including alcohol intoxication, and hazing

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57 laws and institution policies and with information explaining that the institution's disciplinary process is 58 not to be considered a substitute for the criminal legal process.

59 C. Each institution shall provide hazing prevention training to all potential new members for student 60 organizations with new members with extensive, current, and in-person education about hazing, the 61 dangers of hazing, including alcohol intoxication, and hazing laws and institution policies and with 62 information explaining that the institution's disciplinary process is not to be considered a substitute for 63 the criminal legal process.

§ 23.1-821. Hazing; disciplinary immunity for certain individuals who make reports; requirement 64 65 to investigate.

66 A. The governing board of each institution of higher education shall include as part of its policy, code, rules, or set of standards governing sexual violence a provision for immunity from disciplinary 67 action based on hazing or personal consumption of drugs or alcohol where such disclosure is made in 68 69 conjunction with a good faith report of an act of hazing in advance of or during an incident of hazing 70 that causes injury to a person.

B. Upon learning of any alleged act of hazing, each institution shall use its disciplinary process to 71 72 investigate such acts and the students involved in such acts. 73

§ 23.1-822. Institution reports of hazing violations.

74 A. Each institution shall maintain and publicly report actual findings of violations of the institution's 75 code of conduct or of federal or state laws pertaining to hazing that are reported to campus authorities 76 or local law enforcement. Investigations that do not result in findings of violations of codes of conduct 77 or convictions in a court of law shall not be included in the report. The report shall include:

78 1. The name of the student organization recognized by an institution of higher education or local 79 organization, as such name of the local organization is known to the institution;

80 2. When the student organization recognized by an institution of higher education or local 81 organization was found responsible or convicted of misconduct pertaining to hazing;

3. The date on which such hazing misconduct occurred and the dates that the investigation was 82 83 initiated and concluded by the institution or local law enforcement; and

84 4. A comprehensive description of the incident, including the findings, charges, and sanctions placed 85 on the organization.

86 B. Any reports made pursuant to subsection A shall not include any personally identifiable 87 information of any students involved in the hazing misconduct and shall be subject to the Family 88 Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g.

89 C. Each institution shall update the report described in subsection A at least 10 calendar days before 90 the start of fall and spring academic semesters.

91 D. Reports required pursuant to this section shall be available on each institution's homepage and 92 Greek Life homepage, or its equivalent in a prominent location, and a hardcopy notice of the nature 93 and availability of the reports, including the website address where they can be found, shall be provided 94 to all attendees at student orientations.

95 E. Each institution shall publicly maintain reports for a minimum of 10 years from the date of the 96 initial disclosure of a report.

97 F. Each institution shall annually update and report actual findings of violations of the institution's 98 code of conduct or of federal or state laws pertaining to hazing made pursuant to this section to the 99 Timothy J. Piazza Center for Fraternity and Sorority Research and Reform at The Pennsylvania State 100 University to update each organization's national card and provide easily accessible documentation of

all hazing incidents and provide additional awareness and easily accessible information on hazing. 101

2. That beginning with the 2022-2023 academic year, each institution shall maintain and publicly 102

report actual findings of violations of the institution's code of conduct or of federal or state laws 103 pertaining to hazing that are reported pursuant to § 23.1-822 of the Code of Virginia, as created 104

105 by this act, to campus authorities or local law enforcement.
