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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 4.1 of Title 24.2 a section
12	numbered 24.2-471 as follows:
13	§ 24.2-471. Electronic return of voted military-overseas ballots; pilot program.
14	A. The Commissioner of Elections shall establish and supervise a pilot program for the electronic
15	return of voted military-overseas ballots during primaries. An overseas voter who is a registered voter
16	of a participating county or city may return his voted military-overseas ballot by electronic means.
17	B. The Commissioner shall promulgate standards and develop procedures for the secure transmission
18	and return, storage, and processing of voted military-overseas ballots. These standards and procedures
19	shall include:
20	1. Security measures that reasonably secure the transmission, processing, and storage of voter data
21	from interception and unauthorized access;
22	2. Methods for verifying and authenticating the identity of the voter; and
23	3. Methods for the encryption of the voted ballots.
24	The Commissioner shall ensure that any system used for the electronic return of voted
25	military-overseas ballots is auditable and end-to-end verifiable. It shall be capable of allowing the voter
26	to track the transmission of his voted ballot and to determine that the secure transmission of his ballot
27	was successful.
28	The Commissioner shall develop a procedure for a security review to be conducted in each
29	participating county or city after each primary election, based on an evaluation of the number of or any
30	discrepancy in the voted ballots received electronically, and shall issue a report on its findings.
31	The Commissioner may waive the witness signature requirement of § 24.2-707 as part of the pilot
32	program.
33	The Commissioner shall develop a timetable and process for participating counties and cities to
34	notify the voters in the county or city who are eligible to return a voted military-overseas ballot by
35	electronic means through the pilot program. Such process shall include instructions on casting a ballot
36	through the pilot program and notice that an eligible voter has the right to vote by mail.
37	C. Any county or city may apply for participation in the pilot program by submitting a proposal to
38	the Commissioner. The proposal shall be on a form and include such information as prescribed by the
39 40	Commissioner, including the number of voters in the county or city who would be eligible to return a
40	voted military-overseas ballot by electronic means through the pilot program. The Commissioner shall
41 42	prescribe the criteria a locality must meet in order to be approved for participation in the pilot
4 3	<i>A county or city approved for participation shall accept voted military-overseas ballots cast by</i>
4 4	overseas voters in every primary election held in the county or city during its participation in the pilot
45	program.
46	<i>Every participating county and city shall follow all instructions and procedures prescribed by the</i>
47	Commissioner, including participation in the post-primary security review, pursuant to his authority in
48	subsection B.
49	D. Any voter eligible to return his voted military-overseas ballot by electronic means through the
50	pilot program shall be permitted to sign the statement of voter accompanying his military-overseas
51	ballot, and any other documents related to absentee voting or applying to absentee vote, using his
52	digital signature association with his Common Access Card issued by the U.S. Department of Defense or
53	any replacement to the Common Access Card issued by the U.S. Department of Defense. Such signature
54	shall be deemed to meet the requirements of §§ 24.2-706 and 24.2-707.
55	E. In each year of the pilot program, the Commissioner shall conduct a security assessment and
56	update the security measures developed pursuant to subsection B in order to ensure the accuracy and
57	integrity of voted military-overseas ballots returned by electronic means.

- 60 3. That the Commissioner of Elections shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly on 61
- or before December 1, 2027, a report on the outcomes of the pilot program in every participating county or city. The report shall include a recommendation to the General Assembly regarding 62
- whether to implement the electronic return of ballots cast by overseas voters on a permanent, 63
- statewide basis. If making such a recommendation, the report shall also include legislative 64
- 65 recommendations to improve efficiency, effectiveness, and security.
- 66 4. That the provisions of this act shall expire on December 31, 2027.
