22104015D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 137** 1 2 Offered January 20, 2022 3 Designating September, in 2022 and in each succeeding year, as Peripheral Artery Disease Awareness 4 Month in Virginia. 5 Patrons—Price and Plum 6 7 Referred to Committee on Rules 8 WHEREAS, peripheral artery disease, a chronic circulatory condition in which the peripheral arteries 9 are narrowed, limiting their ability to carry blood and oxygen to the extremities of the body, affects 10 nearly 20 million Americans; and 11 WHEREAS, peripheral artery disease (PAD) is the result of atherosclerosis, or the hardening and 12 13 narrowing of the arteries from plaque buildup, and its risk factors include smoking, diabetes, high blood 14 pressure, high cholesterol, coronary artery disease, a family history of serious vascular problems, and 15 limb ischemia; and 16 WHEREAS, PAD restricts the flow of blood, causing less oxygen to reach the body's extremities; in early forms of the disease, this can lead to pain and cramping, while in more advanced stages it can 17 18 result in limb loss; and 19 WHEREAS, PAD most often affects individuals in their lower extremities, and all individuals with 20 risk factors should notify their physician if they experience pain in their legs or feet after walking or 21 exercising, the most common symptom of the disease; and WHEREAS, while many individuals with PAD never experience symptoms, other warning signs 22 23 include pain in the ball of the foot or toes; nighttime foot pain that improves when hanging the foot 24 over the side of the bed; ulcers or sores on the foot, ankle, or toes that do not heal; and blue or black 25 discoloration of the toes; and 26 WHEREAS, it is estimated that approximately 200,000 individuals, including a disproportionate 27 number of individuals from minority communities, will need amputations as a result of PAD that could 28 have been avoided with proper diagnosis and treatment; and 29 WHEREAS, in addition to the risk of amputation, individuals with PAD are at higher risk of 30 suffering other major medical conditions, including critical limb ischemia, heart attack, or stroke; and WHEREAS, PAD affects approximately 12 to 20 percent of Americans ages 60 and older and is 31 32 more commonly found in men than in women; and 33 WHEREAS, all individuals who think they may have PAD should consult their physician, who will 34 be able to easily diagnose the disease through blood pressure measurements, Doppler ultrasounds, 35 arteriograms, and other imaging tests; and 36 WHEREAS, studies have shown that treatment, including reopening blocked or narrowed arteries 37 through a process known as revascularization, can significantly improve circulation and reduce the effects of PAD in a vast majority of patients; and 38 39 WHEREAS, individuals can work to diminish their chances of developing PAD or to slow the 40 progression of the disease by following a healthy lifestyle centered around regular exercise and a 41 balanced diet; and 42 WHEREAS, despite the prevalence of PAD, it often goes unrecognized by individuals and 43 undiagnosed or misdiagnosed by health care professionals, resulting in negative health outcomes and 44 other risks that could be avoided; and WHEREAS, the Cardiovascular Coalition, an organization dedicated to advancing patient access to 45 46 care for PAD, has declared September to be PAD Awareness Month in hopes that increased awareness 47 will improve access to screening and treatments, reduce care costs, prevent limb loss, and enhance the overall well-being of countless individuals; now, therefore, be it 48 49 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate 50 September, in 2022 and in each succeeding year, as Peripheral Artery Disease Awareness Month in 51 Virginia; and, be it 52 RESOLVED FURTHER. That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution 53 to Vascular Cures so that members of the organization may be apprised of the sense of the General 54 Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it 55 RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates post the designation of this month on the General Assembly's website. 56
