| 10        | and birthplace of the United States of America, has been uniquely defined by its rich history and   |
| 11<br>12  | cultural traditions for centuries; and<br>WHEPEAS the study of least history in contrast to condemic history, such as the importance of   |
| 12<br>13  | WHEREAS, the study of local history, in contrast to academic history, emphasizes the importance of place and how the geography that shaped peoples' lives in the past continues to impact individuals |

| 15        | WHEREAS, through a greater awareness and understanding of local history, a locality's resident  |
| 16        | gains an appreciation for his place in the world and cultivates a more meaningful relationship with his   |

| 18        | WHEREAS, a Conference of State and Local Historical Societies was formed within the American  |
| 19        | Historical Association in 1904, and this body later grew into the American Association for State and  |
| 20        | Local History in 1940, marking an increased interest in the study of local history throughout the 20th  |
| 21        | century; and  |
| 22        | WHEREAS, hundreds of local historical and genealogical societies throughout the Commonwealth  |
| 23        | have enthusiastically embraced the task of preserving their communities' histories for the benefit of   |
| 24        | future generations; and   |
| 25        | WHEREAS, local historical and genealogical societies of the Commonwealth further their missions   |
| 26        | through a variety of endeavors, including establishing and maintaining museums, preserving historic   |
| 27        | homes, offering workshops and lectures, and developing archives, and often work with local school   |
| 28<br>29  | systems to help bring the study of history to life for students; and WHEREAS, the accomplishments of local historical and genealogical societies would not be possible                                |
| <b>30</b> | without the selfless and indefatigable efforts of countless volunteer local historians; now, therefore, be it   |
| 30<br>31  | RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate  |
| 32        | October, in 2022 and in each succeeding year, as Local History Month in Virginia; and, be it  |
| 33        | RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution   |
| 34        | to the Pittsylvania Historical Society, on behalf of historical and genealogical societies throughout the   |
| 35        | Commonwealth, so that members of these organizations may be apprised of the sense of the General  |
| 36        | Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it   |
