22104820D 1 **SENATE BILL NO. 131** 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections 4 on January 18, 2022) 5 (Patrons Prior to Substitute—Senators Favola and Marsden [SB 33]) 6 A BILL to amend and reenact § 46.2-1239.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Potomac River Bridge 7 Towing Compact. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That § 46.2-1239.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 46.2-1239.1. Potomac River Bridge Towing Compact. 11 Article I. Parties and Titles. 12 The Parties to this Compact are the Commonwealth of Virginia, the State of Maryland and the District of Columbia. This agreement shall be known as the Potomac River Bridge Towing Compact. 13 Article II. Findings and Purpose. 14 15 The Woodrow Wilson Memorial Bridge, Rochambeau Memorial Bridge, George Mason Memorial Bridge, Theodore Roosevelt Memorial Bridge, Francis Scott Key Bridge, Chain Bridge, Harry W. Nice 16 Bridge, Sandy Hook Bridge, Brunswick Bridge, Point of Rocks Bridge, Arland D. Williams, Jr. 17 Memorial Bridge, and American Legion Memorial Bridge (the Potomac River bridges) all pass through 18 the territorial jurisdiction of two or more of the three Parties. Experience has shown that traffic back-ups 19 20 often prevent state troopers or police officers of the appropriate jurisdiction from arriving at the scene of a disabled or abandoned vehicle to take corrective action. The purpose of this Compact is to facilitate 21 22 the prompt and orderly removal of disabled and abandoned vehicles from the *Potomac River* bridges, as 23 they are currently named or may subsequently be renamed, by giving all three Parties jurisdiction to 24 exercise appropriate authority anywhere on the bridges. 25 Article III. Authority to Direct Traffic and Authorize Removal of Vehicles. The Parties hereby give one another all necessary power and authority to have their respective state 26 27 troopers or local law-enforcement officers direct traffic and authorize the removal of disabled or 28 abandoned vehicles, trailers, semitrailers or the parts or contents thereof, from any part of the Potomac 29 River bridges, to the same extent and in the same manner that such troopers and local law-enforcement 30 officers may exercise such authority in their own jurisdictions. However, no Party, acting through its 31 troopers or local law-enforcement officers, shall have the authority to direct or authorize the towing or 32 removal of any vehicle or other thing to a destination outside its own jurisdiction, unless the consent of 33 an officer or trooper of the destination jurisdiction has been obtained. 34 Article IV. Disposition of Towed Vehicles. 35 All vehicles and their contents towed or removed from the Potomac River bridges pursuant to this Compact shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the place to which such vehicle and its contents 36 are taken, and the handling and disposition of such vehicle and its contents shall be governed by the 37 38 laws and procedures of that jurisdiction. 39 Article V. No Agency. 40 Each of the Parties shall act solely on its own authority within the jurisdiction granted. This Compact 41 shall not be construed as creating any agency relationship between the Parties. 42 Article VI. Effective Date. The provisions of this Compact shall take effect thirty days after the legislative bodies of the Parties 43 44 having jurisdiction over one or several of the bridges identified in Article II have enacted Compacts 45 substantially identical to this Compact. Article VII. Termination. 46 47 The Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia or State of Maryland, or the Mayor of the District of Columbia may withdraw from this Compact at any time upon thirty days' written notice to the other **48** 49 Parties. 2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective only upon enactment by the legislative 50 bodies of the State of Maryland and the District of Columbia of legislation substantially similar to 51 52 this act.
