5.	less with an exhaust system that emits noise in excess of 85 decibels, as measured from a distance of at least 50 feet, unless otherwise provided by law. The bill also adds the Richmond Regional Planning District to the list of local planning districts that may provide by ordinance that no vehicle may be operated within 500 feet of a residential district with an exhaust system that is not in good working order to prevent excessive noise. The bill also adds motor vehicles to the list of types of vehicles that may be in violation of such local ordinances.

8.	Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of State Police (VSP), the proposed legislation would require the agency to purchase decibel meters for all of its troopers so they can determine when an exhaust system noise violates the provisions of the bill. The total cos to purchase decibel meters to implement this legislation is \$53,000. VSP also estimates the agency will incur approximately \$750 annually in printing calibration forms related to this bill. The total annual estimated cost to VSP is \$53,750.
	Any potential fiscal impact to localities or to local law enforcement agencies cannot be determined at this time.
