- **9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Department of Motor Vehicles, state and local law enforcement officers.

- 11. Other Comments: Article 15 and Article 16 of Chapter 10, Title 46.2, enumerate requirements governing maximum vehicle widths, heights, and lengths. Section 46.2-1121 currently requires a flag or light at the end of any load extending more than four feet behind the body of a vehicle. This bill would insert a similar requirement in Section 46.2-1139, but with conflicting provisions regarding the type of flag. In addition, existing regulations require that a flag shall be placed at the extremities of a vehicle load to identify overwidth or secured at the end of the load to identify overhang. The requirements of the current regulations apply only to permitted loads.
