4. Title: Juvenile law-enforcement records; inspection.

5. Summary: Provides that juveniles, parents, guardians, other custodians of the juvenile, and the juvenile's counsel may inspect the juvenile's law enforcement records only if (a) no other law requires or allows withholding of the record, (b) the parent, guardian, or other custodian requesting the record is not a suspect, offender, or person of interest in the record, and (c) any identifying information or any other involved juveniles is redacted. The bill also provides that nothing in § 16.1-301 prohibits the disclosure of reports involving a juvenile that are required to be made to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

8. Fiscal Implications: There is no anticipated fiscal impact on the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) as a result of the provisions of this bill. Any potential fiscal impact on local law enforcement agencies is indeterminate at this time.
