**2. Patron:** Reeves

**3. Committee:** Passed both houses.

**4. Title:** Arrest and summons quotas; prohibition.

**5. Summary:** Provides that no agency of the Commonwealth employing law enforcement officers, including sheriffs, any police force, and the Department of State Police, shall establish a formal or informal quota that requires officers to make a specific number of arrests or to issue a specific number of summonses in a designated time period. Additionally, the bill prohibits using the number of arrests made or summonses issued by a law enforcement officer as the sole criterion for evaluating the officer's job performance.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There is no anticipated fiscal impact on the Department of State Police, the Department of Motor Vehicles, or the Division of Capitol Police as a result of the provisions of this bill. Any potential fiscal impact on other state agencies with law enforcement personnel or local law enforcement agencies is indeterminate at this time.
