2. Patron: Norment

3. Committee: Passed both houses

4. Title: School principals; incident reports.

5. Summary: Requires that school principals report to law enforcement certain enumerated acts that may constitute a criminal, misdemeanor, or felony offense and report to the parents of any minor student who is the specific object of such act that the incident has been reported to law enforcement. Allows but does not require that the principal may report certain non-felony offenses. Under current law, principals are required to make such reports only for such acts that may constitute a felony offense.
