The bill protects certain data collected for the mileage-based user fee program from disclosure. - **8. Fiscal Implications:** The highway use fee became effective on July 1, 2020 and the mileage-based user fee program will become effective on July 1, 2022. This bill provides programmatic clarifications for both the Highway Use Fee (HUF) and mileage-based user fee (MBUF). Owners of vehicles subject to HUF would now be eligible for refunds of that fee if they cancel the vehicle registration with six months or more remaining in the registration period. The legislation offers additional protection for data collected in the MBUF program, and the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) as administrator of the HUF and MBUF programs, and DMV's vendor as administrator of the MBUF program as the proposal offers the vendor support in the collection of unpaid MBUF fees.

In order to implement the bill, the agency will incur programming costs estimated at \$108,118. The 1,468 staff hours required can be accomplished during the normal work schedules for DMV employees, given current workloads.
