11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 1 of Title 22.1 a section numbered
13	22.1-7.3 as follows:
14	§ 22.1-7.3. Organizations governing public school interscholastic programs; participation by
15	students who receive home instruction.
16	A. No public school shall become a member of any organization or entity whose purpose is to
17	regulate or govern interscholastic programs that does not deem eligible for participation a student who
18	(i) receives home instruction pursuant to § 22.1-254.1; (ii) has demonstrated evidence of progress in
19	compliance with subsection C of § 22.1-254.1 for at least two consecutive academic years immediately
20	preceding the academic year during which the student seeks to participate; (iii) is in compliance with
21	the immunization requirements set forth in § 22.1-271.4; (iv) is a person of school age for whom public
22	school is free pursuant to § 22.1-3; (v) has not reached the age of 19 by August 1 of the current
23	academic year; (vi) is an amateur who receives no compensation but participates solely for the
24	educational, physical, mental, and social benefits of the activity; (vii) complies with all disciplinary rules
25	and is subject to all codes of conduct applicable to all public high school athletes; and (viii) complies
26	with all other rules governing awards, all-star games, maximum consecutive semesters of high school
27	enrollment, parental consents, physical examinations, and transfers applicable to all high school
28	athletes. Eligibility of a student who receives home instruction shall be limited to participation in
29	interscholastic programs at the school serving the attendance zone in which the student lives and shall
30	be subject to all policies governing such participation that the local school board may establish.
31	Nothing in this section shall require a local school board to establish a policy permitting participation
32 33	in interscholastic programs at its schools by students who reside in the school division and receive
33	home instruction.

34 35 B. Reasonable fees may be charged to students who receive home instruction to cover the costs of participation in such interscholastic programs, including the costs of additional insurance, uniforms, and *equipment.* 2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2028. 36
