The initiative shall provide an opportunity for every father in the Commonwealth to be able to obtain information and inspiration that will motivate and enable him to enhance his abilities as a father, recognizing that some fathers have greater challenges than others and would benefit from greater support.

The entity shall collaborate with other relevant agencies of the Commonwealth and private 60 organizations to develop and implement the initiative. Such agencies of the Commonwealth shall 61 collaborate with the entity with which the Department contracts to carry out the initiative. 62

## § 63.2-319.1. Fatherhood needs assessment.

63 A. Each local board shall ensure that it is addressing the unique needs of the fathers of children 64 who are served by the local department of social services. 65

B. Each local board shall:

1. Conduct an initial assessment of its engagement with such fathers and provision of and referral to 66 67 father-oriented services.

68 2. Create an action plan to address any gaps identified through the assessment and implement the 69 action plan.

70 3. Employ a father-engagement specialist to, at a minimum, build relationships with fathers, help 71 identify their needs, assist them in accessing services, and communicate with the local board about the challenges faced by these fathers and how to appropriately meet their unique needs. The local board 72 shall prioritize individuals who have faced experiences similar to the fathers who are being served by 73 74 the lead agency for selection as a father-engagement specialist.

75 C. The Department shall annually review how the local board is meeting the needs of fathers, 76 including, at a minimum, how the local board is helping fathers establish positive, stable relationships 77 with their children and assisting fathers in receiving needed services. The local board shall provide any 78 relevant information on how it is meeting the needs of these fathers to the Department. 79

CHAPTĚR 24.

## FATHERHOOD SUPPORT GRANTS PROGRAM AND FUND.

## § 63.2-2400. Fatherhood Support Grants Program and Fund.

A. From the funds appropriated for such purpose and from the gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and other funds received on its behalf, there is established (i) the Fatherhood Support Grants Program, to 82 83 be administered by the Department, and (ii) a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Fatherhood Support Grants Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the 84 85 books of the Comptroller. All moneys appropriated by the General Assembly for the Fund, and received 86 87 from any other sources, public or private, shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. 88 Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys 89 remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the 90 general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be 91 made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the 92 Commissioner.

93 B. Subject to the authority of the Department to provide for its disbursement, the Fund shall be 94 disbursed to award grants to nonprofit community-based organizations to address the needs of fathers. 95 Grants shall be awarded for no more than three years, with subsequent year funding contingent on 96 compliance with grant requirements and adequate performance. Such organizations may apply for 97 grants from the Program on a form approved by the Department. Grant recipients shall submit reports 98 to the Department in a format and at intervals, which shall be at least annually, prescribed by the 99 Department. 100

C. The Department shall award the following types of grants:

101 1. Grants that comprehensively address the needs of fathers, such as assisting them in finding 102 employment, managing child support obligations, transitioning from a period of incarceration, accessing 103 health care, understanding child development, and enhancing parenting skills. Services provided shall be tailored to the needs of the father being served. Case management services shall be provided by the 104 grant recipient, either directly or by subcontract, to the fathers who are served by the grants under this 105 subdivision. If the father receiving case management services through a grant awarded under this 106 107 subdivision has a child receiving case management services from a local department of social services 108 because the child is the subject of a dependency proceeding under Article 9 (§ 16.1-278 et seq.) of 109 Chapter 11 of Title 16.1, the case management services may be coordinated.

110 2. Grants that provide evidence-based parenting education specifically for fathers. The grants under 111 this subdivision shall not require case management services.

C. The Department shall establish criteria for making grants from the Fund, including procedures 112 113 for determining the amount of a grant. The Department may adopt guidelines governing the Program as 114 it deems necessary and appropriate. 115

D. The Department shall prioritize applicants for a grant specified under subsection C based on:

1. Need in a geographic area and the population to be served by the grant as indicated by, at a 116 minimum, unemployment rates, incarceration rates, housing instability, the number of single-parent 117 households, the number of public benefit recipients, graduation rates, and levels of academic 118 119 achievement;

120 2. If an applicant has a primary mission of, or a history of a significant focus on and effective work 121 towards, addressing the needs of men in their role as fathers; 122

3. The applicant's current and historical involvement in the community being served;

123 4. The applicant's commitment and capability to employ competent staff who can effectively engage 124 with the fathers being served, including, at a minimum, those individuals who share a similar 125 background as the fathers being served;

126 5. The number of individuals the applicant plans to serve through the grant and the projected costs 127 for the program; and

128 6. The applicant's organizational capacity to effectively meet the requirements of the grant and to

- 129 deliver the programs proposed by the applicant. The department may offer technical assistance to
- 130 applicants and grant recipients that have lower organizational capacity as long as such organizations
- 131 have, or the organization's leadership has, significant experience serving fathers.
