2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 46.2-380 of the Code of Virginia, relating to crash reports; inspection*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 46.2-380 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**8 **§ 46.2-380. Reports made under certain sections open to inspection by certain persons; copies;**  
9 **maintenance of reports and photographs for three-year period.**

10 A. Any report of a crash made pursuant to § 46.2-372, 46.2-373, 46.2-375, or 46.2-377 shall be  
11 maintained by the Department in either hard copy or electronic form for a period of at least 36 months  
12 from the date of the crash. The report shall be open to the inspection of (i) any person involved or  
13 injured in the crash or as a result thereof, or his attorney, or any person ~~owning~~ *who, at the time of the*  
14 *crash, owned* a vehicle or property involved in the crash, or his attorney, (ii) any authorized  
15 representative of any insurance carrier reasonably anticipating exposure to civil liability as a  
16 consequence of the crash or to which the person has applied for issuance or renewal of a policy of  
17 automobile insurance, or (iii) the FMCSA or any authorized agent thereof. The Commissioner shall,  
18 upon written request of the person authorized to inspect the report, furnish a copy of the report, in either  
19 hard copy or electronic form, at the expense of the requester. Any such report shall also be open to  
20 inspection by the personal representative of any person injured or killed in the crash, including his  
21 guardian, conservator, executor, committee, next of kin as defined in § 54.1-2800, or administrator, or, if  
22 the person injured or killed is under 18 years of age, his parent or guardian. The Commissioner shall  
23 only be required to furnish under this section copies of reports required by the provisions of this article  
24 to be made directly to the Commissioner. The Commissioner may set a reasonable fee for furnishing a  
25 copy of any report, provide to whom payment shall be made, and establish a procedure for payment.

26 B. The Commissioner or Superintendent of State Police having a copy of any photograph taken by a  
27 law-enforcement officer relating to a nonfatal crash shall maintain the negatives for or an electronic  
28 record of such photographs in their records for at least 36 months from the date of the crash.
