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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 38.2-3446.1 as follows:
12	§ 38.2-3446.1. Catastrophic plans.
13	A. As used in this section, "catastrophic plan" means a health benefit plan that satisfies the
14	provisions of 42 U.S.C. § $18022(e)(1)(B)$.
15	B. Notwithstanding any section of this title to the contrary, a catastrophic plan, notwithstanding that
16	it does not provide a bronze, silver, gold, or platinum level of coverage, shall be deemed to (i) provide
17	an essential health benefits package as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 18022(a) and (ii) meet the requirements
18	of § 42 U.S.C. § 18022(d).
19	C. A health carrier may offer catastrophic plans on the individual market and may offer such plans
20	to all individuals.
21	2. That the Commissioner of Insurance shall by September 1, 2023, prepare and submit an
22	application to the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services for a State Innovation
23	Waiver under 42 U.S.C. § 18052 waiving the eligibility restrictions in 42 U.S.C. § 18022(e)(2) for
24	individuals eligible for catastrophic plans offered on the individual market for benefit years
25	beginning January 1, 2025, and future years. The waiver application shall clearly state that the
26	first enactment of this act is contingent on approval of the waiver request. The Commissioner of
27	Insurance shall promptly notify the Governor and the Chairs of the House Committees on
28	Commerce and Energy and Appropriations and the Senate Committees on Commerce and Labor
29	and Finance and Appropriations of any federal actions regarding the State Innovation Waiver
30	request.
31	3. That the first enactment of this act shall be effective 30 days following the date the
32	Commissioner of Insurance notifies the Governor and the Chairs of the House Committees on
33	Appropriations and Commerce and Energy and the Senate Committees on Commerce and Labor
34	and Finance and Appropriations of federal approval of the State Innovation Waiver request
35	required to be submitted by the Commissioner of Insurance pursuant to the second enactment of

this act.
