5. Summary: The substitute bill amends § 4.1-225 (Grounds for which Board may suspend or revoke licenses; exception) to establish that notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision A 1 h, and with respect to the employment of any person who has been convicted in any court of a felony, except as provided in subsection C, or any crime involving moral turpitude, a licensee may (i) immediately employ such person if the offense occurred more than two years preceding the date of employment and the person has completed the term of any probation, if applicable, and has been released from the same and (ii) apply to the Authority for approval of such employment if the offense occurred within two years preceding the date of employment or the person has not yet completed the term of or been released from the term of any probation.

The bill also establishes that notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision A 1 h, and with respect to the employment of any person who has been convicted in any court of the adulteration of any food, drink, or other product in violation of § 18.2-54.2, a licensee may apply to the Authority for approval of such employment.
