3. Committee: Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources

4. Title: Requirements to test for PFAS; publicly owned treatment works; discharges into state waters.

5. Summary: Requires industrial users of publicly owned treatment works that receive and clean, repair, refurbish, or process items that contain PFAS, as defined in the bill, to test wastestreams for PFAS prior to and after cleaning, repairing, refurbishing, or processing such items. The bill requires that pretreatment standards require any industrial user of any such publicly owned treatment works that the industrial user knows or reasonably should know uses PFAS chemicals to test its wastestream for PFAS chemicals prior to and after cleaning, repairing, refurbishing, or processing such items. The bill requires that results of such tests be transmitted to the receiving publicly owned treatment works within three days of receipt.
