4. Title: Crime Victim and Witness Rights Act; notifications to victims; Attorney General.

5. Summary: Current law requires that in a felony case, the attorney for the Commonwealth, upon the victim's written request, must consult with the victim either verbally or in writing (i) to inform the victim of the contents of a proposed plea agreement and (ii) to obtain the victim's views about the disposition of the case, including the victim's views concerning dismissal, pleas, plea negotiations and sentencing. The enrolled bill provides that whenever the Attorney General represents the Commonwealth in any criminal appeal, he must consult with the victim in the same manner.
