**4. Title:**        Notifications in juvenile cases; exception to confidentiality.

**5. Summary:** Provides that whenever an intake officer proceeds informally against a juvenile, the Department of Juvenile Justice or local court service unit may disclose only such information to any law enforcement officer, school principal where such juvenile attends school, or known victim as necessary to enforce any provision of the diversion program. Such information shall remain confidential and not be part of the juvenile's academic record. Additionally, a local court service unit may provide information regarding the availability and ordering of a protective order and restitution and dispositional information to the victim in the case. Such information may be disclosed only as necessary to enforce any provision of the diversion program
