**4. Title:** Long-term services and support screening; PACE programs

**5. Summary:** The substitute bill allows qualified staff of programs of all-inclusive care for the elderly (PACE) to conduct the required long-term services and supports screening in accordance with requirements established by the Department of Medical Assistance Services. In addition, to the extent a long-term services and supports screening team determines it is unable to complete a screening within 30 days or the individual has requested enrollment in a program of all-inclusive care for the elderly (PACE), such screening team must confer as to which entity can most expeditiously conduct the long-term services and supports screening. Qualified staff of the PACE program must be organized to conduct such screening if it is determined that it is the most expeditious option. The bill also directs the Department to adopt emergency regulations to implement the provisions of the bill.
