3	Establishing a joint subcommittee to examine local revenue resources.

8 9	WHEDEAS fixed processing are being experienced by all levels of government but none are more
9 10	WHEREAS, fiscal pressures are being experienced by all levels of government, but none are more severe than those of local governments; and
11	WHEREAS, the fiscal pressure at the local level results from federal and state mandates as well as
12	from the various limitations and conditions which are imposed on local tax and fee sources and tax
13	rates; and
14	WHEREAS, the economy of Virginia is changing and, as a result, the tax structure needs to be
15	examined periodically to ensure that the local tax structure is efficient, promotes equity, and serves the
16	needs of local governments as well as its citizens; and
17	WHEREAS, from 1968 through 1980 the Revenue Resources and Economic Commission examined
18 19	both the state and local tax structures and recommended changes to improve both the equity and efficiency of the tax structures; and
20	WHEREAS, the state and local tax structures have not been thoroughly examined since that time;

22	WHEREAS, the Virginia economy is undergoing tremendous changes and these changes will likely
23	accelerate; and
24	WHEREAS, these changes will affect our tax structure and impact local governments; and
25	WHEREAS, it has been over a decade since Virginia's local tax structure has been thoroughly
26 27	examined; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint subcommittee of the
27 28	House and Senate be established to study the revenue resources and tax structures of Virginia's
29	localities.
30	The joint subcommittee shall identify and examine all local taxes and fees and review the equity of
31	each and report which are the most efficient and least burdensome. The joint subcommittee shall
32	examine also what changes need to be made in our tax structure in light of Virginia's changing
33	economy. The joint subcommittee shall recommend also possible candidates for replacement or
34 35	consolidation. The joint subcommittee shall be composed of nine members as follows: five members of the House
35 36	of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker and four members of the Senate to be appointed by the
37	Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections.
38	The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$6,750.
39	The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study.
40	The joint subcommittee shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations
41	to the Governor and the 1995 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the
42 43	Division of Legislative Automated Systems for processing legislative documents. Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
4 4	Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the
45	study.
