A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23-231.8, 23-231.9, and 23-231.10 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the A.L. Philpott Manufacturing Research Center.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 23-231.8, 23-231.9, and 23-231.10 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:

CHAPTER 16.2.

A. L. Philpott Manufacturing

Research Center

16 § 23-231.8. A. L. Philpott Manufacturing Center created; mission and duties.

From such funds as may be appropriated or provided, there is hereby established the A. L. Philpott 17 Manufacturing Research Center, referred to in this chapter as the Center. The Center shall: 18

1. Develop, demonstrate, test, and assist in the implementation of advanced manufacturing 19 20 technologies.

21 2. Promote industrial expansion by providing manufacturing technology consulting services to 22 manufacturers in Virginia.

23 3. Foster the creation of manufacturing networks and the development of buyer and supplier 24 relationships in the region and throughout the Commonwealth.

25 4. Serve as a resource center for industrial training and technology transfer programs for the renewal, 26 enhancement, and expansion of existing manufacturing enterprises and for manufacturing modernization 27 outreach.

28 5. Be available as a federal demonstration center for the training of displaced workers in a 29 manufacturing area.

30 6. Receive and accept any available grants, from any federal, state, or private agency, corporation, association or person, to be expended in accomplishing the goals enumerated in subdivisions 1 through 5 31 32 above. 33

§ 23-231.9. Membership of governing board; terms; compensation; officers.

34 A. The Center shall be governed by a seventeen-member board of trustees consisting of the three 35 presidents or their designees of threecommunity colleges; two presidents of public four-year institutions of higher education; and one president or his designee of a private four-year institution of higher 36 37 education; four nine citizen members, representing manufacturing industries, to be appointed by the 38 Governor; and the director or his designee president of the Center for Innovative Technology Authority; 39 and the Secretary of Commerce and Trade.

B. Of the members to be appointedInitial appointments in 1992 shall be as follows,: the three 40 community college presidents shall be appointed for two-year, three-year, and four-year terms, 41 respectively; the two presidents of the public four-year institutions shall be appointed for two-year and 42 four-year terms, respectively; the president of a private four-year institution shall be appointed for a 43 44 three-year term; two citizen members shall be appointed for two-year terms, and two citizen members shall be appointed for three-year and four-year terms, respectively. Of the five citizen members to be 45 appointed in 1994, two shall be appointed for two-year terms, two shall be appointed for three-year 46 terms, and one shall be appointed for a four-year term. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for terms 47 of four years, except that appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms. With the **48** exception exceptions of the director or his designee president of the Center for Innovative Technology 49 50 Authority and the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, no person shall be eligible to serve for or during 51 more than two successive four-year terms, but after, however, upon the expiration of a term of three years or less than four years, or after the expiration of the remainder of a term to which appointed to 52 53 fill a vacancy, two additional terms may be served by such member if appointed thereto.

54 C. The board shall elect a chairman and a vice chairman from among its members. All members shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in the work of 55 56 the Center. 57

§ 23-231.10. Executive director; powers and duties; staff.

A. The board shall appoint an executive director for the Center who shall supervise and manage the 58 59 Center and shall prepare and submit, upon direction and approval by the board, all requests for

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60 appropriations. The executive director shall be authorized to employ such staff as necessary to enable

61 the Center to perform its duties as set forth in this chapter. The board is authorized to determine staff 62 duties and to fix salaries and compensation from such funds as may be appropriated or received. In

63 addition, the board is authorized to make arrangements with institutions of higher education to extend

64 course credit to graduate students employed by the Center.

B. Additional staff support for the functions of the Center may be provided by the Center for
Innovative Technology *Authority*, community colleges and four-year institutions of higher education,
small business development centers, and private business.

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
