8	WUEDEAC the reference of the metaline multi-
9 10	WHEREAS, the safety and convenience of the motoring public requires the installation and
10 11	maintenance of numerous highway signs; and WHEPEAS these since inform materiate of distances to various destinctions, eduise them of
11	WHEREAS, these signs inform motorists of distances to various destinations, advise them of maximum safe speeds, and warn them of weight, height, and width limitations of bridges and tunnels;
12	and
14	WHEREAS, in order to be effective, the messages on these signs must be simple, clear, and
15	understandable by passing motorists at a glance; and
16	WHEREAS, it is particularly important that the measurements of distance, speed, size, and weight
17	used on highway signs be uniform and familiar to the vast majority of motorists; and
18	WHEREAS, it has been proposed that measurements of distance, speed, size, and weight presently
19	used on highway signs throughout the United States be replaced with metric measurements or shown in
20	both English and metric units; and
21	WHEREAS, very many motorists in the United States have little or no familiarity with metric
22	measurements; and
23	WHEREAS, this lack of familiarity would impair the motoring public's ability to understand the
24 25	meaning of highway signs at a glance; and
25	WHEREAS, the simultaneous use of both English and metric measurements on highway signs would
26 27	increase the number of characters needed on the signs, possibly increase the size of the signs, probably decrease the public's ability to understand sign messages at a glance, and certainly increase the cost of
28	the signs; and
29 29	WHEREAS, Virginia, like most states, already has more transportation needs than its transportation
<b>3</b> 0	revenues can meet, without the additional expense of replacing existing highway signs solely for the
31	purpose of displaying metric measurements; now, therefore, be it
32	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Congress of the United
33	States be hereby memorialized to refrain from any requirement that otherwise functional highway signs
34	be replaced or reconfigured solely for the purpose of replacing English measurements with metric
35	measurements or adding metric measurements to English measurements; and, be it
36	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit a copy of this resolution to the
37	Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States Senate, and
38	the members of the Virginia delegation to the Congress in order that they may be apprised of the sense
39	of the General Assembly of Virginia in this matter.
