| 10 | WHEREAS, the U.S. Congress enacted a federal Earned Income Credit (EIC) in 1977, as a federal |
| 11 | tax credit for working families; and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, the EIC has been recognized as a valuable economic tool in assisting low-income |
| 13 | individuals by rewarding those who choose to work, rather than subsidizing the income of those who |
| 14 | choose not to work and causing them to become reliant upon public assistance; and |
| 15 | WHEREAS, for several years both Houses of the General Assembly of Virginia have considered |
| 16 | legislation to enact a Virginia Earned Income Credit; and |
| 17 | WHEREAS, both Houses of the General Assembly have consistently delayed action on such |
| 18 | legislation; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, many working individuals in all parts of Virginia — rural, urban, and suburban — |
| 20 | currently eligible for the federal earned income tax credit, would also be eligible for a Virginia Earned |
| 21 | Income Credit as well and have waited long enough: now therefore, be it |
