Compensation Board shall also consider any agreement the sheriff may have pursuant to § 15.1-131.3 and any obligation he may have pursuant to this section to provide law enforcement for towns in fixing the number of deputies. The governing body of any county or city may employ a greater number of law-enforcement deputies than fixed by the Compensation Board, provided that the county or city shall 29 30 pay the total compensation and all employer costs for such additional deputies. 31
