LD0969202 **HOUSE BILL NO. 1716** 1 234567 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the House Committee on Conservation and Natural Resources on February 1, 1995) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Deeds) A BILL to amend and reenact § 10.1-1425.8 of the Code of Virginia, relating to used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze recycling. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That § 10.1-1425.8 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 10.1-1425.8. Department of Transportation; authority and duty. The Department of Transportation is authorized to conduct recycling research projects, including the 11 establishment of demonstration projects which use recycled products in highway construction and 12 maintenance. Such projects may include by way of example and not by limitation the use of ground 13 14 rubber from used tires or glass for road surfacing, resurfacing and sub-base materials, as well as the use of plastic or mixed plastic materials for ground or guard rail posts, right-of-way fence posts and sign 15 16 supports. The Department of Transportation shall periodically review and revise its bid procedures and 17 18 specifications to encourage the use of products and materials with recycled content in its construction 19 and maintenance programs. 20 The Department of Transportation with the cooperation of the Department of Environmental Quality shall conduct a demonstration project at one of the Department of Transportation's maintenance area 21 22 offices in the County of Bath, subject to such conditions as may be determined by the Commonwealth 23 Transportation Commissioner, for the collection of used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze from the 24 general public. The used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze that are collected shall be recycled or 25 otherwise disposed of in accordance with programs and plans developed by the Department of 26 Environmental Quality under § 10.1-1425.6. Funds for this project will shall be provided from the selected county's Secondary Road construction allocations, not to exceed \$20,000 \$5,000 annually. This 27 demonstration project will shall run from July 1, 1993, to June 30, 1995 July 1, 1996. The Department 28 of Transportation, with the cooperation of the Department of Environmental Quality, shall survey the 29 30 counties, cities and towns of the Commonwealth to determine in which localities no commercial facility for the collection of used motor oil and motor vehicle antifreeze exists. Following such survey the 31 Departments of Transportation and Environmental Quality shall identify the advantages and disadvantages of making available to the public the currently existing used oil and used motor vehicle 32 33 antifreeze collection facilities at the Department of Transportation's maintenance area offices in those 34 35 localities where no commercial collection facilities exist. The study will shall be completed and results 36 reported to the 1995 1996 Session of the General Assembly.

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
