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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 33.1-12 of the Code of Virginia, relating to powers of the 3 Commonwealth Transportation Board.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 6

7 1. That § 33.1-12 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 33.1-12. General powers and duties of Board; definitions.

9 The Commonwealth Transportation Board shall be vested with the following powers and shall have 10 the following duties:

(1) Location of routes. - To locate and establish the routes to be followed by the roads comprising 11 12 systems of state highways between the points designated in the establishment of such systems.

13 (2) Construction contracts. - To let all contracts for the construction , and improvement and maintenance of the roads comprising systems of state highways and for all activities related to passenger 14 15 and freight rail and public transportation.

(3) Traffic regulations. - To make rules and regulations, from time to time, not in conflict with the 16 17 laws of this Commonwealth, for the protection of and covering traffic on and the use of systems of state highways and to add to, amend or repeal the same. 18

19 (4) Naming highways. - To give suitable names to state highways and change the names of any 20 highways forming a part of the systems of state highways, except such roads as have been or may 21 hereafter be named by the General Assembly.

(5) Compliance with federal acts. - To comply fully with the provisions of the present or future 22 23 federal aid acts. The Board may enter into all contracts or agreements with the United States 24 government and may do all other things necessary to carry out fully the cooperation contemplated and 25 provided for by present or future acts of Congress in the area of transportation.

26 (6) Information and statistics. - To gather and tabulate information and statistics relating to 27 transportation and disseminate the same throughout the Commonwealth.

(7) Policies and operation of Departments. - To review and approve policies and transportation 28 29 objectives of the Department of Transportation and the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, to 30 assist in establishing such policies and objectives, to oversee the execution thereof, and to report thereon 31 to the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner and the Director of the Department of Rail and 32 Public Transportation, respectively.

33 (8) Cooperation with other agencies. - To cooperate with the federal government, the American 34 Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials and any other organization in the numbering, 35 signing and marking of highways, in the taking of measures for the promotion of highway safety, in research activities, in the preparation of standard specifications, in the testing of highway materials and 36 37 otherwise with respect to transportation projects.

38 (9) Transportation. - (a) To monitor and, where necessary, approve actions taken by the Department 39 of Rail and Public Transportation pursuant to Chapter 10.1 (§ 33.1-391.1 et seq.) of this title in order to 40 ensure the efficient and economical development of public transportation, the enhancement of rail 41 transportation, and the coordination of such rail and public transportation plans with highway programs.

42 (b) To coordinate the planning for financing of transportation needs, including needs for highways, 43 railways, seaports, airports, and public transportation and to set aside funds as provided in § 33.1-23.03:1. 44

45 (c) To enter into contracts with local districts, commissions, agencies, or other entities created for 46 transportation purposes.

47 (10) Contracts with other states. - To enter into all contracts with other states necessary for the 48 proper coordination of the location, construction, maintenance, improvement and operation of 49 transportation systems, including the systems of state highways with the highways of such other states 50 and, where necessary, to seek the approval of such contracts by the Congress of the United States.

(11) Use of funds. - To administer, distribute, and allocate funds in the Transportation Trust Fund as 51 52 provided by law.

53 (12) Financial and investment advisors. - With the advice of the Secretary of Finance and the State 54 Treasurer, to engage a financial advisor and investment advisor who may be anyone within or without 55 the government of the Commonwealth, to assist in planning and making decisions concerning the 56 investment of funds and the use of bonds for transportation purposes. The work of these advisors shall

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57 be coordinated with the Secretary of Finance and the State Treasurer.

58 (13) The powers of the Virginia Aviation Board set out in Chapter 1 (§ 5.1-1 et seq.) of Title 5.1
59 and the Virginia Port Authority set out in Chapter 10 (§ 62.1-128 et seq.) of Title 62.1 are in no way
60 diminished by the provisions of this title.

61 (14) To enter into payment agreements with the Treasury Board related to payments on bonds issued62 by the Commonwealth Transportation Board.

63 (15) Outdoor theaters. - By regulation:

64 (a) To prevent the erection of moving picture screens of outdoor theaters in such a manner as to be ordinarily visible from any highway;

(b) To require that a sufficient space is left between any highway and the entrance to any outdoortheater to prevent congestion on the highway; and

68 (c) To require that outdoor theater entrances and exits are adequately lighted and marked.

69 (16) Maintenance contracts. - To let all contracts equal to or greater than \$250,000 for the 70 maintenance of highways comprising the systems of state highways.

- Throughout this title the term "systems of state highways" shall have the meaning ascribed thereto by
 § 1-13.40.
- 73 The term "public transportation" or "mass transit" as used in this title means passenger transportation
- by rubber-tired, rail, or other surface conveyance which provides shared ride services open to the general
- 75 public on a regular and continuing basis. The term does not include school buses; charter or sight-seeing
- **76** service; vehicular ferry service which serves as a link in the highway network; or human service agency
- 77 or other client-restricted transportation.
