3	Establishing a commission to study regional transportation planning for Northern Virginia.

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9	WHEREAS, Northern Virginia is a growing area of the state with a substantial transportation
10	network; and
11	WHEREAS, businesses and persons traveling within the region cross county and city lines for
12	their private purposes and coordination between counties is necessary for the future economic
13	prosperity of the region; and
14	WHEREAS, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, and Prince William County have become major
15	crossroads for people and goods traveling through these counties; and
16	WHEREAS, there are several regional transportation planning bodies in Northern Virginia and
17	in some cases transportation proposals require the approval of as many as nine different
18	transportation organizations for certain transportation decisions; and
19	WHEREAS, movement between counties continues to increase and will increase in the
20	foreseeable future; now, therefore, be it
21	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That there be hereby
22	established a commission to review regional transportation planning cooperation in Northern
23	Virginia. The commission shall consist of 16 members as follows: the Virginia Secretary of
24	Transportation, who shall serve as chairman of the commission; three members of the House of
25	Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; three members of the Senate,
26	appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; one representative of Fairfax
27	County, appointed by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors; one representative of Arlington
28	County, appointed by the Arlington County Board of Supervisors; one representative of
29 20	Loudoun County, appointed by the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors; one representative
30	of Stafford County, appointed by the Stafford County Board of Supervisors; one representative
31 32	of Prince William County, appointed by the Prince William County Board of Supervisors; one
32 33	representative of the City of Alexandria, appointed by the Alexandria City Council; one representative of the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority, appointed by the Authority,
33 34	and two additional representatives of local governments, appointed by the Governor. The
35	commission's study shall include the following:
36	1. Whether the functions of various transportation organizations should be consolidated into
37	one regional body;
38	2. What mechanisms should be used to manage coordination of transportation plans between
39	the various jurisdictions in Northern Virginia;
40	3. Whether any road or other transportation facilities that connect between counties should be
41	subject to the approval of a regional transportation body;
42	4. Whether this regional transportation body should have a representative from the District of
43	Columbia, Maryland, and the federal government;
44	5. Whether such a body should facilitate the planning of rail, bus, and mass transportation in
45	Northern Virginia;
46	6. What federal, state, and local restrictions exist to hinder or facilitate establishment of such a
47	regional body;
48	7. What funding sources would be available or should be used by such regional transportation
49	body; and
50	8. Any other matter that the commission believes would facilitate regional transportation
51 52	planning in Northern Virginia.
	The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$ 9,500 paid by the Virginia Department of
53 54	Transportation or any other available source. The commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the
54 55	Governor and the 1996 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division
55 56	of Legislative Automated Systems for processing legislative documents.
57	Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint

Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the study.
