2 3 4	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE
3	(Proposed by the House Committee on Rules)

5	House Amendments in [] — February 4, 1995
6	Establishing a joint subcommittee to study the appropriate minimum level of uninsured and
7	underinsured motorist coverage for property damage and personal injury.
8	WHEREAS, Virginia law requires policies of motor vehicle insurance to include coverage to pay an
9	insured all sums he is legally entitled to recover as damages from the owner or operator of an uninsured
10	motor vehicle; and
11	WHEREAS, the minimum amount of uninsured motorist coverage prescribed by law for damage or
12	destruction of the property of the insured in any one accident is \$20,000; and
13	WHEREAS, a portion of an insured's premium is used to cover such \$20,000 minimum coverage;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, the current level of required minimum coverage may exceed the amount of coverage
16	many insureds can reasonably expect to need; and
17	WHEREAS, for fiscal year 1994 according to the Department of Motor Vehicles, 3.2 million cars
18	registered in Virginia were manufactured prior to 1992, 2.4 million of which were manufactured prior to
19	1990; and
20	WHEREAS, DMV statistics indicate, for the same period, that the average price of a new vehicle
21	sold was \$17,401 and the average price of a used vehicle sold was \$4,132; and
22	WHEREAS, many of Virginia's insured and underinsured drivers may not need or desire to have a
23	minimum of \$20,000 in property damage and personal injury coverage; now, therefore, be it
24	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint subcommittee be
25	established to study the appropriate amount of uninsured and underinsured motorist coverage and the
26	minimum level of medical and comprehensive coverage which may be necessary to cover the costs of
27	property damage and personal injury. The joint subcommittee shall consist of seven members as follows:
28	four members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; and three
29	members of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections.
30 21	The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$3,150.
31 32	The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study. Technical assistance
52 33	shall be provided by the Department of Motor Vehicles and the State Corporation Commission. All
55 34	agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the [joint subcommittee], upon request. The joint subcommittee shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations
34 35	to the Governor and the 1996 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the
35 36	Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
