LD1953443 **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 619** 1 2 Offered January 23, 1995 3 Requesting the creation of a joint subcommittee to study the feasibility of establishing a Virginia False 4 5 6 7 Claims Act. Patron-Scott 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, there are persons who present false or fraudulent claims to obtain payments of money or 11 other approvals from the Commonwealth; and WHEREAS, there are persons who use false statements and records to avoid obligations to pay 12 13 money to the Commonwealth; and 14 WHEREAS, the resources available to state agencies to detect fraudulent activity against the 15 Commonwealth could be supplemented through the active involvement of citizens in such detection 16 efforts: and WHEREAS, the encouragement of citizen involvement in bringing such fraudulent claims and 17 activities to the attention of law enforcement officials through a federal False Claims Act (31 U.S.C. 18 § 3729 et seq.) has proven effective in combating fraud against the federal government; now, therefore, 19 20 be it 21 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a five-member joint 22 subcommittee be established to study the feasibility and need for a Virginia False Claims Act. The study 23 shall include an assessment of the effectiveness of efforts by the federal government and other state 24 governments to encourage citizen involvement in combating fraud against the government; the process 25 of integrating such citizen efforts with the work of the Attorney General and other state agencies; and 26 the desirability and means of creating financial incentives to encourage such citizen involvement. The membership of the study shall be appointed as follows: three members of the House of 27 Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker, and two members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate 28 29 Committee on Privileges and Elections. 30 The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$2,250. 31 The Division of Legislative Services shall provide staff support for the study and assistance shall be 32 provided by all agencies of the Commonwealth, upon request. 33 The joint subcommittee shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations 34
