12	WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) conducts
13	retail food store inspections in all of Virginia's localities; and
14	WHEREAS, in 14 localities, ordinances also require local health departments to conduct retail food
15	store inspections; and
16	WHEREAS, while these two food safety and inspection programs are similar, they may be subject to
17	different federal standards as required by the United States Department of Agriculture and Food and
18	Drug Administration or the United States Department of Health; and
19 20	WHEREAS, retail food stores that sell prepared food are subject to varying levels of Virginia Department of Health (VDH) and VDACS inspections, depending upon (i) whether seating is provided

23	WHEREAS, the VDACS, VDH and local food safety inspection programs may impose duplicative or
24	inconsistent requirements that may be unduly burdensome on Virginia's food establishments; now,
25	therefore, be it
26	RESOLVED, by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the VDACS and the VDH be
27	requested to work together to develop a comprehensive, uniform approach to food safety and inspection
28	programs in the Commonwealth that recognizes the authority of localities to administer such programs;
