11 12	WHEREAS, on April 22, 1995, the Pamplin Foundation will dedicate the Pamplin Park Civil War Site in Dinwiddie County; and
13	WHEREAS, Pamplin Park is a private historical complex that will include an interpretive center,
14	battlefield trails, the restored Tudor Hall plantation, and the National Museum of the Civil War Soldier;

16	WHEREAS, Pamplin Park Civil War Site is but the latest example of the dedication of Robert B.
17	Pamplin, Sr., to the education of the citizens of Virginia; and
18	WHEREAS, among the more notable of his many philanthropic contributions to the Commonwealth,
19	Robert Pamplin, Sr., endowed the Pamplin College of Business Administration at Virginia Polytechnic
20 21	Institute and State University and co-chaired the Campaign for Excellence, which raised \$118 million for Virginia Tech; and
22	WHEREAS, Robert Pamplin, Sr., has also sponsored scholarships for students in Dinwiddie for more
23	than 20 years; and
24	WHEREAS, the Pamplin Park Civil War Site will be one of the finest private Civil War parks in the
25	nation and will become a major educational and tourism resource for the Commonwealth; now,
26	therefore, be it
27	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
28	designate April 22, 1995, as Robert B. Pamplin, Sr., Day in Virginia, in honor of his lifetime
29	contributions to education in the Commonwealth; and, be it
