Consent to introduce

WHEREAS, the Rappahannock Preservation Society has undertaken an innovative reef-building project in the tidal waters of the lower Rappahannock River; and

WHEREAS, this unique project uses recycled construction material from the renovation of the Robert O. Norris, Jr. Memorial Bridge; and

WHEREAS, the recycled concrete decking, donated by the bridge contractor, the McLean Contracting Company, is used to construct reefs that the Society hopes will provide a viable habitat for oysters; and

WHEREAS, in additional to their potential for helping Virginia's seriously ailing oyster industry, the reefs should prove a boon to sport fishermen in the area; and

WHEREAS, the Rappahannock Preservation Society's reef-building project, consisting of two existing reefs with two more in the planning stage, is improving a fishery owned by the citizens of Virginia without using state or federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the Rappahannock Preservation Society's project is remarkably innovative, combining private donations, recycling, and cooperation among private and public entities to improve a public resource without the expenditure of public funds; now, therefore, be it
