That § 46.2-749.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 12 § 46.2-749.2. Special Chesapeake Bay preservation plates. 13 14 A. On receipt of an application and payment of the fee prescribed by this section, the Commissioner shall issue special license plates bearing the following legend: FRIEND OF THE CHESAPEAKE. 15 B. The annual fee for plates issued pursuant to this section shall be twenty five dollars in addition 16 to the prescribed fee for state license plates. For each such twenty-five dollar fee collected in excess of 17 1,000 sets issued pursuant to this section, fifteen dollars shall be paid into the state treasury and credited 18 to the special fund known as the Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund, established within the Department 19 20 of Accounts, for use by the Council on the Environment or its successor agency Chesapeake Bay 21 Restoration Fund Advisory Committee for environmental education and restoration projects relating to the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries. No funds collected under this section shall be used for 22 23 administrative expenses or to supplant general fund revenues. The funds may be used to match federal 24 funds. 25 C. There is hereby established the Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund Committee, hereinafter referred 26 to as "the Committee." The Committee shall advise the General Assembly on the expenditure of moneys 27 received in the Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund, hereinafter referred to as "the Fund." The Committee shall develop goals and guidelines for the use of the Fund; solicit project grant applications from 28 29 citizens, organizations, local governments, soil and water conservation districts, state agencies, and 30 others; present an annual plan for expenditures from the Fund to the chairmen of the House SB1050E Appropriations Committee and the Senate Finance Committee no later than December 1 of each year; 31 32 and publicize the use of the funds. No funds shall be released until the plan is completed and submitted 33 to the chairmen of the House Appropriations Committee and the Senate Finance Committee. The 34 Committee shall consist of eight voting members selected as follows: two members of the House of 35 Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; one member of the Senate, appointed by 36 the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; and five members appointed by the Governor, 37 including one representative from a list of nominations submitted by the Chesapeake Bay Commission, 38 one representative from a list of nominations submitted by the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, one 39 representative from a list of nominations submitted by the Virginia Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts, and two citizens from the Commonwealth at large. The Secretary of Natural 40 Resources or his designee shall serve as a nonvoting member of the Committee. The members of the 41 42 Committee shall serve for terms of four years. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired term and shall be made in the same manner as the original appointment. Legislators' terms shall be 43 concurrent with their elected terms of office. The members of the Committee shall elect a chairman and 44 vice- chairman from the membership of the Committee. Members shall receive no compensation for their 45 services, but shall be reimbursed for their necessary and actual expenses incurred in connection with 46 47 their duties as Committee members. The Committee shall meet at least three times each year and **48** additional meetings may be held at the call of the chairman. Staffing for the Committee shall be 49 provided by the Division of Legislative Services. B. The annual fee for plates issued pursuant to this 50 section shall be twenty-five dollars in addition to the prescribed fee for state license plates. For each such twenty-five dollar fee collected in excess of 1,000 sets issued pursuant to this section, fifteen 51 dollars shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the special non-reverting fund known as the 52 Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund, established within the Department of Accounts, for use by the 53 54 General Assembly for environmental education and restoration projects relating to the Chesapeake Bay 55 and its tributaries. Interest earned on the Fund will accrue to the Fund. 2. § 1. Advisory Committee established; membership; duties. 56

A. There is hereby established within the legislative branch the Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund
Advisory Committee to be known as "the Committee". The Committee shall advise the General Assembly
on the expenditure of moneys received in the Chesapeake Bay Restoration Fund (the "Fund").

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B. The Committee shall consist of nine persons as follows: three members of the House of Delegates 60 and two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, one of whom shall be a 61 62 representative of the Chesapeake Bay Foundation; two members of the Senate and two persons 63 appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections, one of whom shall be a representative of the Virginia Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts. All persons appointed to the 64 65 Committee shall be representative of the interests associated with the restoration and conservation of the 66 Chesapeake Bay. The Secretary of Natural Resources, or his designee, shall serve as a nonvoting 67 member of the Committee. Members of the Committee shall serve for terms of four years. Legislators' terms shall be concurrent with their elected terms of office. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for **68** the unexpired term and shall be made in the same manner as the original appointment. Members shall 69 not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms. The Committee shall elect a chairman and 70 71 vice-chairman from among its legislative membership. Members shall receive no compensation for their 72 services, but shall be reimbursed out of the Fund for their necessary and actual expenses incurred in 73 connection with their duties as Committee members. The Committee shall meet at least one time each 74 year, and additional meetings may be held at the call of the chairman.

75 C. The Committee shall develop goals and guidelines for the use of the Fund, which may include but 76 not be limited to cooperative programs with, or project grants to, state agencies, the federal 77 government, or any not-for-profit agency, institution, organization, or entity, public or private, whose 78 purpose is to provide environmental education and projects relating to the restoration and conservation 79 of the Chesapeake Bay. Moneys in the Fund may not be used to supplant existing general fund 80 appropriations except as provided in subsection B.

81 D. No later than December 1 of each year, the Committee shall present to the Governor and the 82 General Assembly a plan for expenditure of any amounts in the Fund.

83 E. Staffing of the Committee shall be provided by the Division of Legislative Services.]
