14	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
16	1. That § 2.1-1.5 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia
17	is amended by adding in Chapter 32.1 of Title 2.1 an article numbered 7, consisting of sections

Article 7.

Virginia Economic Development Partnership Act.

121 § 2.1-548.26. Short title.

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- This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Virginia Economic Development Partnership Act." 122 123 § 2.1-548.27. Definitions.
- 124 The following terms, whenever used or referred to in this Act, have the following meanings, except 125 where the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 126 "Authority" means the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, the body corporate and political 127 subdivision of the Commonwealth created by this Act.
- 128 "Board" means the Board of directors of the Authority.
- 129 "Federal agency" means the United States; the President of the United States; and any department, 130 corporation, agency, or instrumentality heretofore or hereafter created, designated, or established by the 131 United States.
- 132 "Person" means natural persons, firms, foundations, associations, corporations, business trusts, 133 partnerships, joint ventures, and public bodies, including but not limited to the Commonwealth of Virginia; any state; and any agency, department, institution, political subdivision or instrumentality of 134 135 the Commonwealth or any state.
- § 2.1-548.28. Authority created. 136
- 137 The Virginia Economic Development Partnership, hereinafter referred to as the Authority, is created 138 as a body corporate and political subdivision and as such shall have, and is hereby vested with, the 139 powers and duties hereinafter conferred in this chapter.
- 140 § 2.1-548.29. Economic development services.
- 141 It shall be the duty of the Authority to encourage, stimulate, and support the development and 142 expansion of the economy of the Commonwealth. The Authority is charged with the following duties and 143 responsibilities:
- 144 1. See that there are prepared and carried out effective economic development marketing and 145 promotional programs;
- 146 2. Make available, in conjunction and cooperation with localities, chambers of commerce, industrial 147 authorities, and other public and private groups, to prospective new businesses basic information and 148 pertinent factors of interest and concern to such businesses:
- 149 3. Formulate, promulgate, and advance programs throughout the Commonwealth for encouraging the 150 location of new businesses in the Commonwealth and the retention and growth of existing businesses;
- 151 4. Encourage and solicit private sector involvement, support, and funding for economic development 152 in the Commonwealth;
- 153 5. Encourage the coordination of the economic development efforts of public institutions, regions, 154 communities, and private industry and collect and maintain data on the development and utilization of 155 economic development capabilities; and
- 156 6. Establish such offices within and without the Commonwealth that are necessary to the expansion 157 and development of industries and trade.
- 158 § 2.1-548.30. Planning and research.
- 159 It shall also be the duty of the Authority to:
- 160 1. Assist in the development of the comprehensive economic development strategy for the Commonwealth, starting the first year of each new gubernatorial administration, consistent with the provisions of Chapter 5.9 (§ 2.1-51.38 et seq.) of Title 2.1; 161 162
- 163 2. Report annually to the Governor on the status of the implementation of the comprehensive 164 economic development strategy and recommend legislative and executive actions related to the 165 implementation of the comprehensive economic development strategy; and
- 166 3. Conduct such studies and research, in collaboration with state agencies, universities, local and 167 regional industrial authorities and organizations, and other persons within and without the 168 Commonwealth, as the Board may deem necessary, to assist in the development of the comprehensive 169 economic strategy and the development of recommendations and advice on the improvement of economic 170 development and related programs and strategies across the Commonwealth.
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- § 2.1-548.31. Board of directors; members and officers; Executive Director.
- 172 All powers, rights, and duties conferred by this Act, or other provisions of law, upon the Authority 173 shall be exercised by the Board of Directors of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, 174 hereinafter referred to as the Board. The Board shall consist of the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, 175 the Secretary of Finance, and [eleven thirteen] members, one from each congressional district in the 176 *Commonwealth* [and two at-large members], appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by 177 the General Assembly. Four of the [eleven thirteen] directors initially appointed by the Governor shall 178 be appointed for terms of two and one-half years, four for terms of four and one-half years, and [three 179 five] for terms of six and one-half years, from the effective date of their appointment; and thereafter the 180 terms of members of the Board shall be six years. No member appointed by the Governor shall be 181 eligible to serve more than two terms; however, after the expiration of a term of four years or less, two 182 additional terms may be served if appointed thereto. Any appointment to fill a vacancy shall be for the

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183 unexpired term. A person appointed by the Governor to fill a vacancy may be appointed to serve two 184 additional terms. Members of the Board shall receive their expenses and shall be compensated at the

185 rate provided in § 2.1-20.3 for each day spent on the business of the Board.

186 The Board shall elect from its membership a chairman and a vice-chairman, and shall also elect a 187 secretary and a treasurer, who may or may not be members of the Board, and may also elect other 188 subordinate officers, who may or may not be members of the Board, as it shall deem proper. The Board 189 may also form committees and advisory councils, which may include representatives who are not 190 members of the Board, to undertake more extensive study and discussion of the issues before the Board.

191 The Board shall appoint the chief executive officer of the Authority, who shall not be a member of 192 the Board, who shall be known as the Executive Director and who shall serve at the pleasure of the 193 Board and carry out such of the powers and duties conferred upon him as may be delegated by the 194 Board.

§ 2.1-548.32. Powers and duties of the Executive Director.

196 The Executive Director shall employ or retain such agents or employees subordinate to the Executive 197 Director as may be necessary to fulfill the duties of the Authority conferred upon the Executive Director, 198 subject to the Board's approval. The Executive Director shall also exercise such of the powers and 199 duties relating to the direction of the state's economic development efforts conferred upon the Authority 200 as may be delegated to him by the Board, including powers and duties involving the exercise of 201 discretion. The Executive Director shall also exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may 202 be lawfully delegated to him or as may be conferred or imposed upon him by law.

203 § 2.1-548.33. Bylaws and organization.

204 The Authority shall have the power to adopt, alter, and repeal bylaws, rules, and regulations 205 governing the manner in which its business shall be transacted and the manner in which the powers of 206 the Authority shall be exercised and its duties performed. 207

§ 2.1-548.34. Powers not restrictive.

208 The Authority shall have the power to perform any act or carry out any function not inconsistent 209 with state law, whether included in the provisions of this chapter, which may be useful in carrying out 210 the provisions of this chapter. 211

§ 2.1-548.35. Powers of Authority.

212 The Authority is hereby granted and shall have and may exercise all powers necessary or convenient 213 for the carrying out of its statutory purposes, including, but without limiting the generality of the 214 foregoing, the power to: 215

I. Sue and be sued, implead and be implead, complain and defend in all courts;

2. Adopt, use, and alter at will a common seal;

217 3. Acquire, purchase, hold, use, lease or otherwise dispose of any property, real, personal or mixed, 218 tangible or intangible, or any interest therein necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of the 219 Authority, and to lease as lessee, any property, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any 220 interest therein, at such annual rental and on such terms and conditions as may be determined by the 221 Board of the Authority and to lease as lessor to any person, any property, real, personal or mixed, 222 tangible or intangible, or any interest therein, at any time acquired by the Authority, whether wholly or 223 partially completed, at such annual rental and on such terms and conditions as may be determined by 224 the Board of the Authority, and to sell, transfer or convey any property, real, personal or mixed, 225 tangible or intangible, or any interest therein, at any time acquired or held by the Authority on such 226 terms and conditions as may be determined by the Board of the Authority, provided that the terms of 227 any conveyance or lease of real property shall be subject to the prior approval of the Governor in 228 writing:

229 4. Fix, alter, charge and collect rates, rentals, fees, and other charges for the use of property of, the 230 sale of products of, or services rendered by the Authority at rates to be determined by it for the purpose 231 of providing for the payment of the expenses of the Authority;

5. Make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of 232 233 its duties, the furtherance of its purposes, and the execution of its powers under this Act, including 234 agreements with any person or federal agency;

235 6. Employ, at its discretion, consultants, researchers, attorneys, architects, engineers, accountants, 236 financial experts, investment bankers, superintendents, managers and such other employees and agents 237 as may be necessary, and to fix their compensation to be payable from funds made available to the 238 Authority. The Authority may hire employees within and without the Commonwealth and the United 239 States without regard to whether such employees are citizens of the Commonwealth.

240 7. Receive and accept from any federal or private agency, foundation, corporation, association or 241 person, grants or other aid to be expended in accomplishing the objectives of the Authority, and receive 242 and accept from the Commonwealth or any state, and any municipality, county or other political subdivision thereof or from any other source, aid or contributions of either money, property, or other 243 things of value, to be held, used, and applied only for the purposes for which such grants and 244

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245 contributions may be made. All federal moneys accepted under this section shall be accepted and 246 expended by the Authority upon such terms and conditions as are prescribed by the United States and 247 as are consistent with state law; and all state moneys accepted under this section shall be expended by 248 the Authority upon such terms and conditions as are prescribed by the Commonwealth.

249 8. Render advise and assistance and to provide services to state agencies, local and regional 250 economic development entities, private firms, and other persons providing services or facilities for 251 economic development in Virginia;

252 9. Develop, undertake, and provide programs, alone or in conjunction with any person, for economic 253 research, industrial development research, and all other research that might lead to improvements in 254 economic development in Virginia;

255 10. Do all acts and things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers granted to it by this Act 256 or any other acts.

257 § 2.1-548.36. Appropriations by any government.

258 Any government may make appropriations for the acquisition, construction, improvement, 259 maintenance or operation of any property acquired, constructed, improved, maintained or operated by 260 the Authority.

261 § 2.1-548.37. Conveyance, lease or transfer of property by a city or county to the Authority.

262 Any city or county within the Commonwealth in order to provide for the construction, reconstruction, 263 improvement, repair or management of any property, or in order to accomplish any of the purposes of 264 this Act may, with or without consideration or for a nominal consideration, lease, sell, convey or 265 otherwise transfer to the Authority any real, personal or mixed property located within such city or 266 county.

267 § 2.1-548.38. Exemption of Authority from personnel and procurement procedures.

268 The provisions of Chapter 10 (§ 2.1-100 et seq.) of Title 2.1 and Chapter 7 (§ 11-35 et seq.) of Title 269 11 of the Code of Virginia shall not apply to the Authority in the exercise of any power conferred under 270 this Act.

271 § 2.1-548.39. Exemption of Authority from the Virginia Freedom of Information Act for certain types 272 of information.

273 Confidential records, voluntarily provided by private business pursuant to a promise of 274 confidentiality from the Authority or local or regional industrial development authorities or 275 organizations, used by the Authority and such entities for business, trade, and tourism development, and 276 records, memoranda, working papers and data and information related to the development of and 277 negotiations with businesses that are considering locating or expanding in Virginia, when such data and 278 records identified as confidential or of a proprietary nature by the Board, shall be excluded from the 279 provisions of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.1-340 et seq.).

280 § 2.1-548.40. Moneys of Authority.

281 All moneys of the Authority, from whatever source derived, shall be paid to the treasurer of the 282 Authority. Such moneys shall be deposited in the first instance by the treasurer in one or more banks or 283 trust companies, in one or more special accounts. All banks and trust companies are authorized to give 284 such security for such deposits, if required by the Authority. The moneys in such accounts shall be paid 285 out on the warrant or other orders of such person or persons as the Authority may authorize to execute 286 such warrants or orders. 287

§ 2.1-548.41. Forms of accounts and records; audit; annual report.

288 The accounts and records of the Authority showing the receipt and disbursement of funds from 289 whatever source derived, shall be in such form as the Auditor of Public Accounts prescribes. The Auditor of Public Accounts of the Commonwealth, and his legally authorized representatives, shall 290 291 annually examine the accounts and books of the Authority. The Authority shall submit an annual report 292 to the Governor and General Assembly on or before November 1 of each year, beginning in 1996. Such report shall contain the audited annual financial statements of the Authority for the year ending the 293 294 previous June 30. The annual report shall be distributed in accordance with the provisions of § 2.1-467. 295 The Authority shall submit a detailed annual operational plan and budget to the Secretary of Commerce 296 and Trade and the Director of the Department of Planning and Budget by November 1, beginning in 297 1996. Notwithstanding other provisions of this Act, the form and content of the operating plan and 298 budget shall be determined by the Director of the Department of Planning and Budget and shall include 299 information on salaries, expenditures, indebtedness and other information as shall be determined by the 300 Director of Planning and Budget.

301 § 2.1-548.42. Exemptions from taxes or assessments.

302 The exercise of the powers granted by this Act will be in all respects for the benefit of the people of 303 the Commonwealth, for the increase of their commerce and prosperity, and for the improvement of their 304 living conditions, and as the undertaking of activities in the furtherance of the purposes of the Authority 305 will constitute the performance of essential governmental functions, the Authority shall not be required

to pay any taxes or assessments upon any property acquired or used by the Authority under the provisions of this Act or upon the income therefrom, including sales and use taxes on the tangible personal property used in the operations of the Authority. The exemption hereby granted shall not be construed to extend to persons conducting on the premises of any property of the Authority businesses
for which local or state taxes would otherwise be required.

311 § 2.1-548.43. State agencies to furnish information and assistance.

312 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall assist the Authority upon its request and furnish such 313 assistance and information as the Authority may require in the discharge of its duties.

314 § 2.1-548.44. Nonstock corporation to assist economic development.

The Board is hereby authorized to establish nonprofit, nonstock corporations under Chapter 10 (§ 13.1-801 et seq.) of Title 13.1 as public instrumentalities exercising public and essential governmental functions, to assist the Board and the Authority in (i) promoting Virginia's economic development efforts in the national and international corporate community; (ii) raising money in the corporate and nonprofit community to pay for advertising and promotion of the Commonwealth; (iii) raising nonstate dollars to complement state and local economic development activities; or (iv) conducting or undertaking other activities useful in carrying out the provisions of this Act.

The Board of directors of any such corporation shall be composed of the Executive Director of the
 Virginia Economic Development Partnership and eight members appointed by the Board.

324 The Board shall require any such corporation to report to it annually on its activities.

325 2. That the Board of Directors of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, hereinafter 326 referred to as the Authority, created pursuant to the first enactment of this act, in collaboration with the Secretary of Commerce and Trade and others as it may deem appropriate, shall develop 327 an operational plan and budget for the 1996-1998 biennium. The plan shall identify functions to be 328 transferred from the Department of Economic Development, staffing requirements of the 329 330 Authority, expected contributions from the private sector, and other details as may be appropriate for the orderly commencement of operations of the Authority. In developing the plan, the Board 331 332 shall consider the recommendations of the Governor's Commission on the Development of the 333 Virginia Travel and Tourism Industry with regard to the placement of the tourism promotion efforts of the Commonwealth. The plan and proposed budget shall be presented to the Governor 334 and the General Assembly by December 15, 1995. No functions shall be transferred from the 335 336 Department of Economic Development to the Authority before July 1, 1996.
