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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 54.1-106 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 54.1-106. Health care professionals rendering services to patients of certain clinics exempt from
13	liability.
14	A. No person who is licensed or certified by the Boards of/for Audiology and Speech-Language
15 16	Pathology, Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, Optometry, Opticians, Pharmacy, Hearing Aid Specialists, Psychology, Social Work or Professional Counselors who renders at any site any health care services
17	within the limits of his license or certification, voluntarily and without compensation, to any patient of
18	any clinic which is organized in whole or in part for the delivery of health care services without charge,
19	shall be liable for any civil damages for any act or omission resulting from the rendering of such
20	services unless the act or omission was the result of his gross negligence or willful misconduct.
$\overline{21}$	For purposes of this section, physicians [and dentists] serving on active duty in the United States
22	armed services and assigned to duty as a practicing physician [or dentist] at a military hospital or
23	medical facility owned and operated by the United States government and which is located in the
24	Commonwealth shall be deemed to be licensed physicians [or dentists].
25	B. For the purposes of Article 5.1 (§ 2.1-526.1 et seq.) of Chapter 32 of Title 2.1, any person
26	rendering such health care services who (i) is registered with the Division of Risk Management and (ii)
27	has no legal or financial interest in the clinic from which the patient is referred shall be deemed an
28	agent of the Commonwealth and to be acting in an authorized governmental capacity with respect to
29	delivery of such health care services. The premium for coverage of such person under the Risk
30	Management Plan shall be paid by the Department of Health.

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
