12	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
13	1. That § 46.2-342 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 46.2-342. What license to contain; Uniform Donor Document.
15	A. Every license issued under this chapter shall bear:
16	1. A For new, renewal, or replacement licenses issued on or after July 1, 1995, either (i) a license
17 18	number which shall be the same as the licensee's social security number, or (<i>ii</i>) if he either has no social security number or requests in writing that his social security number not be used, a control
19	number which shall be assigned by the Department to the licensee if he has no social security number;
20	2. A dated color photograph of the licensee;
21	3. The licensee's name, year, month, and date of birth;
22	4. The licensee's address;
23	5. A brief description of the licensee for the purpose of identification;
24	6. A space for the signature of the licensee; and
25	7. Any other information deemed necessary by the Commissioner for the administration of this title.
26 27	No abbreviated names or nicknames shall be shown on any license. A1. At the option of the licensee, the address shown on the license may be either the post office
28	box, business, or residence address of the licensee. However, regardless of which address is shown on
29	the license, the licensee shall supply the Department with his residence address. This residence address
30	shall be maintained in the Department's records. Whenever the licensee's address shown either on his
31	license or in the Department's records changes, he shall notify the Department in writing of such change
32	as required by § 46.2-324.
33	B. The license shall be cardboard or other suitable material or combination thereof and in a form to
34	be determined by the Commissioner.
35 36	C. Photographs, for licensees under twenty-one years of age at the time of issuance of the license, shall be profile photographs; but photographs for licensees twenty-one years of age or older at the time
30 37	of issuance of the license shall be front face view photographs. Notwithstanding the preceding provisions
38	of this subsection, the first and subsequent photographs for persons under twenty-one years of age shall
39	be profile photographs until the original issued license has expired.
40	D. The Department shall establish a method by which an applicant for a driver's license or an
41	identification card may designate his willingness to be an organ donor as provided in Article 2
42	(§ 32.1-289 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 32.1 and shall cooperate with the Virginia Transplant Council
43	to ensure that such method is designed to encourage organ donation with a minimum of effort on the
44 45	part of the donor and the Department.E. If an applicant designates his willingness to be a donor pursuant to subsection D, the Department
4 5 46	may make a notation of this designation on his license or card and shall make a notation of this
47	designation in his driver record.
48	F. The donor designation authorized in subsection E shall be sufficient legal authority for the
49	removal, following death, of the subject's organs or tissues without additional authority from the donor,
50	or his family or estate.
51	G. The donor designation provided pursuant to subsection D may only be rescinded by appearing in
52	person at a Department branch office. The Department shall notify the prospective donor of this
53 54	requirement at the time he authorizes donor designation.
54 55	H. With the written consent of his parent or legal guardian, a minor may make a donor designation. I. When requested by the applicant, and upon presentation of a signed statement by a licensed
55 56	physician confirming the applicant's condition, the Department shall indicate on the applicant's driver's
57	license that the applicant is an insulin-dependent diabetic.
58	J. In the absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct, the Department and its employees shall
59	be immune from any civil or criminal liability in connection with the making of or failure to make a

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60 notation of donor designation on any license or card or in any person's driver record.

K. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, the Department shall continue to use the uniform donor document, as formerly set forth in subsection D above, for organ donation designation until such time as a new method is fully implemented, which shall be no later than July 1, 1994. Any such uniform donor document, shall, when properly executed, remain valid and shall continue to be subject to all conditions for execution, delivery, amendment, and revocation as set out in Article 2 (§ 32.1-289 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 32.1.
