A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 2.1-1.6, 9-6.25:1, 10.1-1414, 10.1-1415, 10.1-1416, 10.1-1422 and 58.1-1710 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding sections numbered 10.1-1422.01 through 10.1-1422.05 and by adding in Article 1 of Chapter 17 of Title 58.1 a section numbered 58.1-1705, relating to litter control and recycling.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 2.1-1.6, 9-6.25:1, 10.1-1414, 10.1-1415, 10.1-1416, 10.1-1422 and 58.1-1710 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding sections numbered 10.1-1422.01 through 10.1-1422.05 and by adding in Article 1 of Chapter 17 of Title 58.1 a section numbered 58.1-1705, as follows:

§ 2.1-1.6. State boards.

311 § 10.1-1414. Definitions.

312 As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

313 *"Advisory Board" means the Litter Control and Recycling Fund Advisory Board;*

314 "Disposable package" or "container" means all packages or containers intended or used to contain
315 solids, liquids or materials and so designated;

316 *"Fund" means the Litter Control and Recycling Fund;*

317 "Litter" means all waste material disposable packages or containers but not including the wastes of
318 the primary processes of mining, logging, sawmilling, farming, or manufacturing;

319 "Litter bag" means a bag, sack, or durable material which is large enough to serve as a receptacle for
320 litter inside a vehicle or watercraft which is similar in size and capacity to a state approved litter bag;

321 "Litter receptacle" means containers acceptable to the Department for the depositing of litter;

322 "Person" means any natural person, *corporation*, association, firm, receiver, guardian, trustee,
323 executor, administrator, fiduciary, representative or group of individuals or entities of any kind;

324 "Public place" means any area that is used or held out for use by the public, whether owned or
325 operated by public or private interests;

326 "Recycling" means the process of separating a given waste material from the waste stream and
327 processing it so that it may be used again as a raw material for a product which may or may not be
328 similar to the original product;

329 "Sold within the Commonwealth" or "sales of the business within the Commonwealth" means all
330 sales of retailers engaged in business within the Commonwealth and in the case of manufacturers and
331 wholesalers, sales of products for use and consumption within the Commonwealth;

332 "Vehicle" includes every device capable of being moved upon a public highway and in, upon, or by
333 which any person or property may be transported upon a public highway, except devices moved by
334 human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks; and

335 "Watercraft" means any boat, ship, vessel, barge, or other floating craft.

336 § 10.1-1415. Litter Control Program.

337 The ~~Director~~*Department* shall ~~establish within the Department a Division of Litter Control and~~
338 ~~Recycling to conduct a continuous program support local, regional and statewide programs~~ to control,
339 prevent and eliminate litter from the Commonwealth and to encourage the recycling of discarded
340 materials to the maximum practical extent. ~~He shall appoint a qualified person to direct the work of the~~
341 ~~Division. The Department shall administer such program with funds generated from litter control taxes~~
342 ~~and from such other funds as may be appropriated. Litter control taxes shall include the taxes increased~~
343 ~~by Chapter 616 of the 1977 Acts of Assembly and the taxes imposed under §§ 58.1-1700 through~~
344 ~~58.1-1710. Every department of state government and all governmental units and agencies of the~~
345 ~~Commonwealth shall cooperate with the Department in the administration and enforcement of this~~
346 ~~article.~~

347 This article is intended to add to and coordinate existing litter control removal and recycling efforts,
348 and not to terminate existing efforts nor, except as specifically stated, to repeal or affect any state law
349 governing or prohibiting litter or the control and disposition of waste.

350 § 10.1-1416. Collection and survey of litter.

351 Collections and surveys of the kinds of litter that are discarded in violation of the laws of the
352 Commonwealth shall be conducted as the need is determined by the Department, *after receipt of the*
353 *recommendations of the Advisory Board*, or as directed by the General Assembly. The survey shall
354 include litter found throughout the Commonwealth, including standard metropolitan statistical areas and
355 rural and recreational areas. To the fullest extent possible, in standard metropolitan statistical areas the
356 Department of Transportation shall make use of local litter and trash collection services through
357 arrangements with local governing bodies and appropriate agencies, in the discharge of the duties
358 imposed by this section. The Department of Transportation shall report to the Governor, the General
359 Assembly and the Department as to the amount of litter collected pursuant to this section and shall
360 include in its report an analysis of litter types, their weights and volumes, and, where practicable, the
361 recyclability of the types of products, packages, wrappings and containers which compose the principal
362 amounts of the litter collected. The products whose packages, wrappings and containers constitute the
363 litter shall include, but not be limited to the following categories:

364 1. Food for human or pet consumption;

365 2. Groceries;

366 3. Cigarettes and tobacco products;

367 4. Soft drinks and carbonated waters;

5. Beer and other malt beverages;
 6. Wine;
 7. Newspapers and magazines;
 8. Paper products and household paper;
 9. Glass containers;
 10. Metal containers;
 11. Plastic or fiber containers made of synthetic material;
 12. Cleaning agents and toiletries;
 13. Nondrug drugstore sundry products;
 14. Distilled spirits; and
 15. Motor vehicle parts.

§ 10.1-1422. Further duties of Department.

In addition to the foregoing duties the Department shall:

1. Serve as the coordinating agency between the various industry and business organizations seeking to aid in the recycling and anti-litter effort;
2. Recommend to local governing bodies that they adopt ordinances similar to the provisions of this article;
3. Cooperate with all local governments to accomplish coordination of local recycling and anti-litter efforts;
4. Encourage, ~~organize, and coordinate~~ all voluntary local recycling and anti-litter campaigns seeking to focus the attention of the public on the programs of the Commonwealth to control and remove litter and encourage recycling;
5. Investigate the availability of, and apply for, funds available from any private or public source to be used in the program provided for in this article;
6. Allocate funds annually for the study of available research and development in recycling and litter control, removal, and disposal, as well as study methods for implementation in the Commonwealth of such research and development. In addition, such funds may be used for the development of public educational programs concerning the litter problem and recycling. Grants shall be made available for these purposes to those persons deemed appropriate and qualified by the Board or the Department;
7. Investigate the methods and success of other techniques in recycling and the control of litter, and develop, encourage and coordinate programs in the Commonwealth to utilize successful techniques in recycling and the control and elimination of litter;
8. ~~Promulgate regulations for making either direct or matching grants to localities to promote enforcement of anti-litter statutes and ordinances and to enhance local recycling and litter control programs; and~~

98. ~~Expend, after receiving the recommendations of the Advisory Board, at least fiftyseventy-five percent of the funds allocateddeposited annually to the Litter Control and Recycling Program into the Fund pursuant to contracts with localities. The Department may enter into contracts with planning district commissions for the receipt and expenditure of funds attributable to localities which designate in writing to the Department a planning district commission as the agency to receive and expend funds hereunder.~~

§ 10.1-1422.01. *Litter Control and Recycling Fund established; use of moneys; purpose of Fund.*

A. *All moneys collected from the taxes imposed under §§ 58.1-1700 through 58.1-1710 and by the taxes increased by Chapter 616 of the 1977 Acts of Assembly, shall be paid into the treasury and credited to a special nonreverting fund known as the Litter Control and Recycling Fund, which is hereby established. The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. Any moneys remaining in the Fund shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Interest earned on such moneys shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. The Director is authorized to release money from the Fund on warrants issued by the Comptroller after receiving and considering the recommendations of the Advisory Board for the purposes enumerated in subsection B of this section.*

B. *Moneys from the Fund shall be expended, according to the allocation formula established in subsection C of this section, for the following purposes:*

1. *Local litter prevention and recycling grants to localities that meet the criteria established in § 10.1-1422.04;*
2. *Statewide and regional litter prevention and recycling educational program grants to persons meeting the criteria established in § 10.1-1422.05; and*
3. *Payment to (i) the Department to process the grants authorized by this article and (ii) the administrative costs of the Advisory Board. The Director shall assign one person in the Department to serve as a contact for persons interested in the Fund.*

C. *All moneys deposited into the Fund shall be expended pursuant to the following allocation formula:*

429 1. Seventy-five percent for grants made to localities pursuant to subdivision B 1 of this section;
430 2. Twenty percent for statewide and regional educational program grants made pursuant to
431 subdivision B 2 of this section; and

432 3. Five percent for the administrative expenditures authorized pursuant to subdivision B 3 of this
433 section.

434 § 10.1-1422.02. Litter Control and Recycling Fund Advisory Board established; duties and
435 responsibilities.

436 There is hereby created the Litter Control and Recycling Fund Advisory Board. The Advisory Board
437 shall:

438 1. Review applications received by the Department for grants from the Fund and make
439 recommendations to the Director for the award of all grants authorized pursuant to § 10.1-1422.01;

440 2. Promote the control, prevention and elimination of litter from the Commonwealth and encourage
441 the recycling of discarded materials to the maximum practical extent; and

442 3. Advise the Director on such other litter control and recycling matters as may be requested by the
443 Director or any other state agency.

444 § 10.1-1422.03. Membership, meetings, and staffing.

445 A. The Advisory Board shall consist of five persons appointed by the Governor. Three members shall
446 represent persons paying the taxes which are deposited into the Fund and shall include one member
447 appointed from nominations submitted by recognized industry associations representing retailers; one
448 member appointed from nominations submitted by recognized industry associations representing soft
449 drink distributors; and one member appointed from nominations submitted by recognized industry
450 associations representing beer distributors. One member shall be a local litter or recycling coordinator.
451 One member shall be from the general public.

452 B. Members shall serve four-year terms unless found to violate subsection E of this section. They
453 shall not receive a per diem, compensation for their service, or travel expenses.

454 C. The Advisory Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman annually from among its members.
455 The Advisory Board shall meet at least twice annually on such dates and at such times as they
456 determine. Three members of the Advisory Board shall constitute a quorum.

457 D. Staff support and associated administrative expenses of the Advisory Board shall be provided by
458 the Department from funds allocated from the Fund.

459 E. Any member who is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Advisory Board, as certified by
460 the Chairman of the Advisory Board to the Secretary of the Commonwealth, shall be dismissed as a
461 member of the Advisory Board. The replacement of any dismissed member shall be appointed pursuant
462 to subsection A of this section and meet the same membership criteria as the member who has been
463 dismissed.

464 § 10.1-1422.04. Local litter prevention and recycling grants; eligibility and funding process.

465 The Director shall award local litter prevention and recycling grants to localities that apply for such
466 grants and meet the eligibility requirements established in the Department's Guidelines for Litter
467 Prevention and Recycling Grants (DEQ-LPR-2) which were in effect on January 1, 1995, and as may be
468 amended by the Advisory Board after notice and opportunity to be heard by persons interested in grants
469 awarded pursuant to this section. Grants awarded by the Director shall total the amount of Litter
470 Control and Recycling Funds available annually as provided in subdivision B 1 of § 10.1-1422.01.

471 § 10.1-1422.05. Statewide and regional litter control and recycling grants.

472 The Director, after receiving the recommendations of the Advisory Board, shall award statewide and
473 regional litter prevention and recycling grants to persons for the public purpose of the development and
474 implementation of statewide and regional litter prevention and recycling educational programs. For
475 purposes of this section, the term "person" includes any nonprofit entity that the Director finds has
476 experience and success in statewide litter control and recycling educational programs and has a
477 membership that represents the Commonwealth at large as well as any person meeting the definition of
478 "person" in § 10.1-1414. Grants awarded by the Director pursuant to this section shall total the amount
479 of litter control and recycling funds available annually as provided in subdivision B 2 of § 10.1-1422.01.

480 § 58.1-1705. Disposition of proceeds.

481 All moneys collected pursuant to this article, minus the necessary expenses of the Department of
482 Taxation for the administration of this tax, as certified by the Commissioner, shall be deposited into the
483 Litter Control and Recycling Fund established pursuant to § 10.1-1422.01.

484 § 58.1-1710. Disposition of proceeds.

485 All moneys collected pursuant to this article, minus the necessary expenses of the Department of
486 Taxation for the administration of this tax, as certified by the Commissioner, shall be deposited into the
487 general fund of the state treasury Litter Control and Recycling Fund established pursuant to
488 § 10.1-1422.01.

489 2. That this act shall become effective July 1, 1995; however, the amendments made to
490 §§ 10.1-1415 and 10.1-1422 by this act, and §§ 10.1-1422.04 and 10.1-1422.05 shall become effective

491 July 1, 1996.

492 3. That any moneys deposited into the Fund prior to July 1, 1996, in an amount equal to that
493 appropriated for such a purpose in fiscal year 1995-1996 by Chapter 996 of the 1994 Acts of
494 Assembly, shall be expended by the Director to fund the Division of Litter Control and Recycling
495 as required by § 10.1-1415 until the amendments to that section made by the first enactment of
496 this act become effective July 1, 1996.

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
