1	SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 268
2	Offered January 13, 1995
3	Memorializing the President and the Congress to maintain federal funding of Amtrak, to exempt Amtrak
4	from fuel taxes, to permit the states to use federal highway funds to support Amtrak, and to include
5	Amtrak in any plans for a national transportation system.

11	WHEREAS, Amtrak is an energy-efficient and environmentally beneficial means of transportation,
12	consuming about one-half as much energy per passenger mile as airline travel and causing less air
13	pollution; and
14 15	WHEREAS, Amtrak provides mobility to citizens of many smaller communities poorly served by air and bus service, as well as to senior citizens, disabled people, and people with medical conditions that
15 16	preclude flying; and
17	WHEREAS, on a passenger-mile basis, Amtrak is nine times safer than driving an automobile and
18	operates safely even in severe weather conditions; and
19	WHEREAS, the number of passengers using Amtrak rose 48 percent from 1982 to 1993, allowing
20	Amtrak to dramatically improve coverage of its operating costs from revenues; and
21	WHEREAS, expansion of Amtrak service by existing rail rights-of-way would cost less and use less
22	land than either new highways or new airports and would further increase Amtrak's energy-efficiency
23	advantage; and
24	WHEREAS, federal investment in Amtrak has fallen in the last decade, while it has risen for both
25	highways and airports; and
26	WHEREAS, states may use highway trust fund money as an 80 percent federal match for a variety
27	of non-highway programs, but they are prohibited from using such funds for Amtrak projects; and
28	WHEREAS, Amtrak pays a fuel tax that airlines do not pay; and
29	WHEREAS, Amtrak workers and vendors pay more in taxes than the federal government invests in
30 31	Amtrak; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
31 32	urge the President and the Congress of the United States to make no further reductions in funding for
33	Amtrak; and, be it
33 34	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the General Assembly request that Amtrak be excused from paying
35	fuel taxes that the airlines do not pay, that the states be permitted to use federal highway trust fund
36	moneys on Amtrak projects if they so choose, and that federal officials include a strong Amtrak
37	component in any plans for a national transportation system; and, be it
38	RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution to the
39	President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President
40	of the United States Senate, and the members of the Virginia congressional delegation so that they may
41	be apprised of the sense of the General Assembly of Virginia.
