LD2144667 **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 369** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 34 56 7 (Proposed by the House Committee on Rules on February 16, 1995) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Hawkins) Establishing a joint subcommittee to study incentives to promote economic development in the Commonwealth. 8 WHEREAS, competition among states and localities for business expansion and relocation projects 9 has become increasingly intense during the past decade; and WHEREAS, in order to successfully attract and retain these projects, state and local governments 10 11 have created a variety of incentives to encourage companies to locate or remain in a particular area; and WHEREAS, the federal government has also created several tax relief and grant policies to foster 12 growth in economically disadvantaged localities; and 13 14 WHEREAS, incentive packages offered to business have become an important factor to many 15 companies concerning where a relocation or expansion will occur; and 16 WHEREAS, as a result of the perceived importance of incentives, the number of incentives offered 17 and the cost of these incentives to state and local governments continue to increase; and 18 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has undertaken several studies to examine the costs and benefits of 19 particular incentives; and 20 WHEREAS, none of these studies have effectively examined the incentives currently offered by the 21 state to determine their effectiveness and to ensure that they are being targeted most efficiently; and 22 WHEREAS, "Opportunity Virginia: A Strategic Plan for Jobs and Prosperity" identified the need for 23 a comprehensive study of incentives to promote economic development; and 24 WHEREAS, there are additional economic development incentives which require further study before 25 being implemented; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That a joint subcommittee be 26 27 established to study incentives to promote economic development in the Commonwealth. The joint 28 subcommittee shall conduct a comprehensive study examining the following: (i) various initiatives 29 offered by the state to attract and retain businesses in the Commonwealth in order to promote job 30 creation and investment in Virginia's communities; (ii) the powers of the proposed Virginia Economic Development Partnership, including whether it should be directly involved in assisting with site and 31 32 project development and what role it should be given in managing state incentives; and (iii) alternative 33 incentive strategies to better utilize existing resources and new incentives. 34 The joint subcommittee shall be composed of nine members as follows: two members of the Senate 35 to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; three members of the House of 36 Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; two citizens to be appointed by the Governor; 37 and the Secretary of Commerce and Trade and the Secretary of Finance. 38 The Department of Economic Development shall provide staff support to the joint subcommittee. All 39 agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the joint subcommittee, upon request. 40 The direct cost of this study shall not exceed \$7,500. 41 The joint subcommittee shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations 42 to the Governor and the 1996 General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents. 43 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 44 Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the 45 46 study.

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
