WHEREAS, small businesses have traditionally generated much of the economic growth and new 18 19 jobs in the nation; and

20 WHEREAS, the number of women-owned businesses in the Commonwealth has grown significantly 21 from about 57,000 in 1982 to almost 95,000 in 1987, an increase of 60 percent; and 22

WHEREAS, the gross receipts of these businesses rose by 240 percent over this period; and

23 WHEREAS, women-owned businesses are playing an increasingly significant role in Virginia's 24 economy and overall economic growth; and

25 WHEREAS, the women who own and operate such businesses are vital and vibrant sources of 26 information about business, microbusiness, or job-training; and

27 WHEREAS, there are numerous departments, agencies, commissions, boards, and other entities of the 28 Commonwealth under the direction and control of the Secretary of Commerce and Trade; now, 29 therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, That the Secretary of Commerce and Trade be requested to ensure that 30 31 women who are knowledgeable about business, microbusiness, or job-training participate in the development of the economic policies of the Commonwealth through the various departments, agencies, 32 commissions, boards, and other entities of the Commonwealth under the direction and control of the 33 34 Secretary of Commerce and Trade.
