That § 51.1-153 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 12 § 51.1-153. Service retirement. 13 14 A. Normal retirement. - Any member in service at his normal retirement date with five or more years 15 of creditable service may retire at any time upon written notification to the Board setting forth the date the retirement is to become effective. Any member in service who was denied membership prior to July 16 1, 1987, as a result of being age sixty or over when first employed may retire at any time after his 17 18 normal retirement date and the requirement of having five or more years of service shall not apply. B. Early retirement. - Any member in service who has attained his fifty-fifth birthday with five or 19 20 more years of creditable service may retire prior to his normal retirement date upon written notification 21 to the Board setting forth the date the retirement is to become effective. 22 C. Deferred retirement for members terminating service. - Any member who terminates service after five or more years of creditable service may retire under the provisions of subsection A or B of this 23 24 section if he has not withdrawn his accumulated contributions prior to the effective date of his 25 retirement or if he has five or more years of creditable service for which his employer has paid the 26 contributions and such contributions cannot be withdrawn. For the purposes of this subsection, any 27 requirements as to the member being in service shall not apply. No member shall be entitled to the 28 benefits of this subsection if his employer certifies that his service was terminated because of 29 dishonesty, malfeasance, or misfeasance in office. The certification may be appealed to the Board. 30 D. 50/10 retirement. - Any member in service on or after January 1, 1994, who has attained his 31 fiftieth birthday with ten or more years of creditable service may retire prior to his normal retirement 32 date upon written notification to the Board setting forth the date the retirement is to become effective. A 33 member who is a state employee shall not be eligible for retirement pursuant to this subsection unless 34 the employee has entered into a binding agreement with the Department of Personnel and Training 35 providing that the employee shall not thereafter re-enter into full-time or part-time employment with any 36 agency in the executive branch of the Commonwealth for a period of two years following retirement. 37

E. Effective date of retirement. - The effective date of retirement shall be after the last day of service of the member, but shall not be more than ninety days prior to the filing of the notice of retirement.

39 F. Notification on behalf of member. - If the member is physically or mentally unable to submit 40 written notification of his intention to retire, the member's appointing authority may submit notification 41 on his behalf.

2. That the provisions of this act shall apply to all persons who retired pursuant to the provisions 42

of subsection D of § 51.1-153 on or after March 10, 1995. 43

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
