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## HOUSE BILL NO. 1064

Offered January 22, 1996

A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23-38.53:4, 23-38.53:5, and 23-38.53:6 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Guaranteed Assistance Program.

10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 23-38.53:4, 23-38.53:5, and 23-38.53:6 of the Code of Virginia are amended and 11 reenacted as follows: 12

§ 23-38.53:4. Program created; State Council of Higher Education and Superintendent of Public 13 14 Education to administer; promulgation of regulations.

15 There is hereby created the Virginia Guaranteed Assistance Program to provide financial assistance to eligible low-income students for the costs of attending a public institution of higher education in 16 17 Virginia. All such financial assistance shall be applied exclusively to the remission, in whole or in part, of tuition and required fees and to cover the costs of books, supplies, or other educational expenses as 18 may be approved by the State Council of Higher Education. Funds may be paid to any public or private 19 20 institution of higher education on behalf of eligible, low-income students who have been awarded financial assistance pursuant to § 23-38.53:6. The Council shall promulgate regulations for the 21 implementation of the provisions of this chapter. 22 23

§ 23-38.53:5. Virginia Guaranteed Assistance Fund created.

24 A. There From such public or private funds as may be appropriated or received for this purpose, 25 there is hereby created in the Department of the Treasury a special nonreverting fund which shall be known as the Virginia Guaranteed Assistance Fund. The Virginia Guaranteed Assistance Fund shall be 26 27 established on the books of the Comptroller, and any funds remaining in such Fund at the end of each 28 fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Interest earned on such 29 funds shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Funds may be paid to any public institution of 30 higher education on behalf of students who have been awarded financial assistance pursuant to the provisions of § 23-38.53:6. On and after July 1, 1995, any funds remaining in the Fund shall be credited 31 to the account of the State Council of Higher Education.B. The Department of the Treasury shall 32 33 administer and manage the Virginia Guaranteed Assistance Fund, subject to the authority of the State 34 Council of Higher Education to provide for its disbursement, from such *public or private* funds as are 35 given, donated, granted, bequested, otherwise received, or appropriated for this purpose and from such 36 gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and other private or public funds as may be received or appropriated 37 on its behalf. The Fund shall be disbursed for the purpose of making grants to be determined by the use 38 of a needs analysis methodology approved by the Council. The first such awards shall be made after July 1, 1994. The Council shall award such grants to *eligible* students who are enrolled in or accepted 39 40 for enrollment in any public or private institution of higher education in Virginia, as provided in 41 § 23-38.53:6. The amount of each grant awarded to an eligible, low-income student shall be used only 42 for payment of charges for tuition and fees, and to cover the costs of books, supplies or other education expenses as may be approved by the State Council of Higher Education.. 43 44

§ 23-38.53:6. Eligible low-income students; criteria for awarding grants; renewals.

A. Only To be eligible to receive the grants, eligible students who shall be (i) are domiciled residents of Virginia as defined by § 23-7.4, (ii) are graduates of a high school in the Commonwealth 45 46 with a cumulative secondary school grade point average of at least 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 or its 47 equivalent, (iii) are accepted for enrollment as dependent students in any public institution of higher **48** 49 education in Virginia, and (iv) are not receiving state discretionary aid and demonstrate financial need as 50 defined by the State Council of Higher Education shall be eligible to receive such awards.

51 B. The amount of the Guaranteed Assistance Program grant awarded students shall be determined 52 annually by the State Council of Higher Education. Eligibility for such awards shall be determined 53 according to the Congressional methodology for determining financial need and eligibility for financial 54 aid.

55 C. All grants shall be awarded for one year, but may be renewed annually for no more than three subsequent years of study if the recipient: 56

57 1. Maintains at least a 2.0 grade point average on a scale of 4.0 or its equivalent;

2. Demonstrates continued financial need; 58

59 3. Makes satisfactory academic progress toward a degree, earning not less than the minimum number

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of hours of credit required for full-time standing in each academic period during enrollment at a public 60 61

institution of higher education in Virginia; and 4. Maintains continuous enrollment for not less than two semesters or three quarters in each 62 63 successive academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the State Council of Higher 64 Education.
